SUBJECT: Assessment of U.S./Coalition Efforts to Train, Advise, Assist, and Equip the Afghan National Army Special Operations Forces (ANASOF) (Project No. D2016-D00SPO-0054.000)

We plan to begin the subject assessment immediately. This project relates to the overseas contingency operation, Operation Resolute Support, and will be completed in accordance with the oversight responsibility of the Office of the Inspector General, as described in Section 8L of the Inspector General Act of 1978, as amended. Our objective is to determine whether U.S. Government and Coalition goals, objectives, plans, and resources to train the Afghan National Army Special Operations Forces are sufficient, operative, and relevant. We will consider suggestions from management on additional or revised objectives or for future assessments.

We plan to visit or contact organizations and individuals in the continental United States and in the U.S. Central Command area of responsibility that are responsible for training, advising, and equipping the Afghan National Army Special Operations Forces (ANASOF). This will include appropriate offices and selected individuals in the Afghan National Defense Security Forces. Specific organizations to be visited will be identified before and during the field assessment, and arrangements for those visits will be made through established official points of contact.
