SUBJECT: Assessment of U.S. Government and Coalition Efforts to Develop the Afghan Local Police (Project No. D2011-D00SPO-0277.000)


We plan to begin this assessment immediately. The objective of this assessment is to determine whether the planning and operational implementation of efforts by US/Coalition Forces to recruit, train, advise, and assist in the development of the Afghan Local Police (ALP) is effective. This includes evaluating output/outcome at ALP locations at various stages of their life cycle to determine the effectiveness of U.S./Coalition involvement in developing the ALP and Ministry of Interior capability to manage the program.

We plan to visit or contact organizations in the continental United States and in the U.S. Central Command area of responsibility that are responsible for developing the ALP. Specific organizations to be visited will be identified before and during the field assessment, and arrangements for those visits will be made through established official points of contact.

Combatant Commands/subordinate organizations listed below are to provide a point of contact for this assessment. The point of contact must at or above GS-15 civilian grade or O6 military grade.
