## MEMORANDUM FOR DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Assessment of the Nuclear Warhead Unsatisfactory Report Process (Project No. D2014-DINT02-0199.000)

We plan to begin the subject assessment in August 2014. Our objective is to assess processes used for reporting DoD nuclear warhead Unsatisfactory Reports (UR). Specifically, we will assess the UR notification and transmission processes, the efficiency of DoD's interface with Sandia National Laboratory, and the extent that training and technical order changes may decrease the frequency of URs. We will consider suggestions from management on additional or revised objectives.

We will perform this assessment in the offices of the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Nuclear Matters; Defense Threat Reduction Agency; Headquarters, U.S. Navy; Headquarters, U.S. Air Force; Navy Strategic Systems Programs; Submarine Group 10; Air Force Global Strike Command; and the Air Force Nuclear Weapons Center. We may identify additional locations during the assessment.
