SUBJECT: Evaluation of the Implementation of Public Law 111-258, the "Reducing Over-Classification Act," Within the Department of Defense, Phase II (Project No. D2014-DINT01-0016.000)

We will begin the subject evaluation in October 2013. Public Law 111-258, Section 6(b), October 7, 2010, established the requirement for two separate reports that calls for federal Inspectors General to evaluate the policies, procedures, rules, regulations, or management practices that may be contributing to persistent misclassification of material; and ascertain if the applicable classification policies, procedures, rules, and regulations have been adopted, followed, and effectively administered.

Our first report was published on September 30, 2013. We found that applicable classification policies, procedures, rules, and regulations have been adopted; but in some circumstances, they had not been followed or effectively administered. We concluded that some policies, procedures, rules, regulations and management practices may be contributing to persistent misclassification of material. Our second report, which is due September 30, 2016, will focus on the progress made in addressing the issues identified in the first evaluation under this law.

We will perform this evaluation at DoD and Component organizations. Additional organizations may be identified during the project.
