SUBJECT: Termination of Assessment of U.S. and Coalition Efforts to Train, Advise, Assist, and Equip the Iraqi Federal Police (Project No. D2017-D00SPO-0117.000)

We announced the subject evaluation on March 17, 2017 (attached). The objective was to assess the U.S. and Coalition efforts to train, advise, assist, and equip the Iraqi Federal Police in support of operations against the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS). We are terminating this evaluation because despite suffering heavy losses in the liberation of Mosul, there is no known plan to reconstitute the Iraqi Federal Police, and no training scheduled for the Iraqi Federal Police in the near future.

However, we plan to announce a new evaluation focused on U.S. and Coalition efforts to train, advise, assist, and equip an Iraqi Police Hold Force in support of stability operations.
