Alexander Moore was appointed keeper on 3 JAN 1896 and transferred to Station Boge Inlet on 30 SEP 1904.

William T. WIllis was appointed keeper on 17 SEP 1904 and transferred to Station Cape Lookout on 19 APR 1912.

Henry D. Goodwin was appointed keeper on 10 APR 1912 and was still serving in 1915.

CBM (L) I. N. Baum was OIC in 1929.
