Date	Unit	Description
6/1/2018	VMFAT-101, 3d MAW	At a Special Court-Martial at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, California, Lance Corporal F. J. Ping was convicted by a military judge of driving under the influence and wrongfully impersonating a noncommissioned officer. The military judge sentenced the accused to reduction to E-1, 60 days restriction, 90 days hard labor without confinement, and a bad-conduct discharge. The pre-trial agreement had no effect on the sentence.
6/1/2018	CLB-4, CLR-3, 3d MLG	At a General Court-Martial in Okinawa, Japan, Lance Corporal J. A. Poindexter was convicted by a military judge of wrongful possession of child pornography. The military judge sentenced the accused to four years confinement, reduction to E-1, a reprimand, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and a dishonorable discharge. Pursuant to a pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to suspend all confinement in excess of 36 months.
6/1/2018	CLB-2, CLR-2, 2dMLG	At a General Court-Martial at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, Lance Corporal M. J. Marasco was convicted by a military judge of burglary, sexual assaults, communicating a threat, and aggravated assault. The military judge sentenced the accused to 28 years confinement, reduction to E-1, and a dishonorable discharge. Pursuant to a pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to suspend all confinement in excess of 10 years.
6/2/2018	MCSFBN, MARFORCOM	At a General Court-Martial at Parris Island, South Carolina, First Sergeant M. C. Lippencott was convicted by a panel of officer and enlisted members of two violations of the lawful command from a superior commissioned officer. The members sentenced the accused to no punishment.
6/4/2018	I MIG, I MEF	At a Special Court-Martial at Camp Pendleton, California, a corporal was acquitted of conspiracy and obstruction of justice by a panel of officer and enlisted members.

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6/6/2018	HqRegt, 2dMLG	At a General Court-Martial at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, Private First Class P. J. Fink was convicted by a military judge of sexual abuse of a child by indecent exposure, sexual abuse of a child, and four specifications of sexual assault of a child. The military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge. Pursuant to a pre-trial agreement, the dishonorable discharge will be commuted to a bad-conduct discharge.
6/7/2018	MALS-11, MAG-11, 3d MAW	At a General Court-Martial at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, California, Lance Corporal C. A. Lopez was convicted by a panel of officer and enlisted members of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery. The members sentenced the accused to 60 days confinement and a bad-conduct discharge.
6/7/2018	III MIG, III MEF	At a Special Court-Martial in Okinawa, Japan, Master Sergeant A. R. Cortez Jr. was convicted by a military judge of larceny and false official statements. The military judge sentenced the accused to reduction to E-7, reprimand, and forfeiture of \$1,000.00 per month for five months. Pursuant to the pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to disapprove the forfeitures.
6/7/2018	5th Anglico, III MIG, III MEF	At a General Court-Martial in Okinawa, Japan, Corporal R. A. Salazar II was convicted by a military judge of sexual assault and abusive sexual contact. The military judge sentenced the accused to nine years confinement, reduction to E-1, a reprimand, total forfeitures, and a dishonorable discharge. Pursuant to a pre-trial, the convening authority agree to suspend all confinement in excess of 36 months.

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6/8/2018	BLT 1/1, 31st MEU, III MEF	At a General Court-Martial in Okinawa, Japan, Sergeant B. J. Hubbard was convicted by a military judge of conspiracy to distribute a schedule I drug, wrongful exportation of a controlled substance, wrongful introduction of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, and wrongful distribution of a controlled substance. The military judge sentenced the accused to six years confinement, reduction to E-1, a reprimand, total forfeitures of all pay and allowances, and dishonorable discharge. Pursuant to a pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to suspend all confinement in excess of 18 months, disapprove all adjudged forfeitures, and defer all automatic forfeitures provided an allotment is maintained for the benefit of the subject's dependents.
6/12/2018	3d TSB, CLR-3, 3d MLG	At a Special Court-Martial in Okinawa, Japan, Lance Corporal M. J. Bellinger was convicted by a military judge of attempted wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, failure to obey a lawful general order, wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and wrongful use of a controlled substance. The military judge sentenced the accused to eight months confinement, reduction to E-1, a reprimand, forfeiture of \$1,000.00 per month for 12 months, and a bad-conduct discharge. The military judge recommended clemency in the form of administrative separation with an Other Than Honorable characterization of service.
6/13/2018	Marine Corps Cyberspace Warfare Group	At a Special Court-Martial at Marine Corps Base Quantico, Sergeant A. C. Genung was convicted by a military judge of conspiracy; wrongful use, manufacture, and distribution of marijuana and mushrooms; and wrongful possession of drug paraphernalia. The military judge sentenced the accused to a bad-conduct discharge, reduction to E-1, and seven months confinement. The pre-trial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

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6/13/2018	3dBn, 8thMarRegt, 2dMarDiv	At a Special Court-Martial at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, Lance Corporal N. K. Williams was convicted by a military judge of conspiracy to commit aggravated assault and soliciting another to commit aggravated assault. The military judge sentenced the accused to 325 days confinement, reduction to E-1, and a bad-conduct discharge. Pursuant to a pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to suspend all confinement in excess of nine months.
6/13/2018	1st MarReg, 1st MarDiv	At a General Court-Martial at Camp Pendleton, California, Lance Corporal R. A. Somershoe was convicted by a military judge of possession of child pornography, sexual abuse of a child, and extortion. The military judge sentenced the accused to 20 years confinement and a dishonorable discharge. The pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.
6/14/2018	3d Supply Bn, CLR-35, 3d MLG	At a General Court-Martial in Okinawa, Japan, Lance Corporal A. M. Hernandez was convicted by a military judge of sexual abuse of a child, solicitation, and possession of child pornography. The military judge sentenced the accused to 10 years confinement, reduction to E-1, reprimand, total forfeitures, and a dishonorable discharge. Pursuant to the pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to suspend all confinement in excess of 36 months.
6/14/2018	4thMCD	At a Special Court-Martial at Parris Island, South Carolina, Staff Sergeant J. K. Moussakembe was convicted by a panel of officer and enlisted members of absence from unit, disobeying a staff noncommissioned officer, and dereliction in the performance of duties. The members sentenced the accused to receive a reprimand and a fine of \$10,000.00.
6/14/2018	I MLG	At a General Court-Martial at Camp Pendleton, California, a corporal was acquitted by a panel of officer and enlisted members of assault.
6/18/2018	MCI-W	At a General Court-Martial at Camp Pendleton, California, Private First Class Z. T. Frederick was convicted by a panel of officer and enlisted members of violating a lawful general order and unlawful entry. The members sentenced the accused to no punishment.

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6/20/2018	MCCES, MCAGCC	At a General Court-Martial at Twentynine Palms, California, Private First Class K. M. Robinson was convicted by a military judge of distribution of child pornography, possession of child pornography, viewing child pornography, communicating indecent language, solicitation of production of child pornography, and attempting to distribute child pornography. The military judge sentenced the accused to reduction to E-1, total forfeitures, 10 years confinement, and a dishonorable discharge. Pursuant to a pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to award one day of confinement credit for every two days of pre-trial restriction served.
6/21/2018	1stBn, 10thMarReg, 2dMarDiv	At a Special Court-Martial at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, Corporal C. S. Addison was convicted by a military judge of wrongful uses of a controlled substance, attempting to escape from custody, disrespect toward a noncommissioned officer, and willful disobedience of a superior commissioned officer. The military judge sentenced the accused to 179 days confinement, reduction to E-1, and a bad-conduct discharge. Pursuant to a pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to suspend all confinement in excess of 90 days.
6/21/2018	HQ & SPT Bn	At a General Court-Martial in Okinawa, Japan, Sergeant W. L. Grubbs Jr. was convicted by a panel of officer and enlisted members of attempted sexual assault of a child, and solicitation. The members sentenced the accused to eight months confinement, reduction to E-1, total forfeitures of all pay and allowances, dishonorable discharge.
6/21/2018	1st MarDiv	At a General Court-Martial at Camp Pendleton, California, Lance Corporal D. O. Williams was convicted by a military judge of wrongfully using a controlled substance, larceny, and house breaking. The military judge sentenced the accused to reduction to E-1, a fine of \$2,500.00, three years confinement, and a bad conduct discharge. The pre-trial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

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6/26/2018	31st MEU, III MEF	At a Special Court-Martial in Okinawa, Japan, Sergeant J. R. Izquierdo was convicted by a military judge of assault consummated by battery and disorderly conduct. The military judge sentenced the accused to 90 days confinement, reduction to E-1, and a bad-conduct discharge. The pre-trial agreement had no effect on the sentence adjudged.
6/27/2018	VMX-1, MCAS Yuma	At a General Court-Martial at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, Corporal J. Xiong was convicted by a military judge of attempted sexual abuse of a child by indecent communication, attempted receipt of child pornography, and attempted sexual assault of a child. The military judge sentenced the accused to 27 months confinement, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, reduction to E-1, and a dishonorable discharge. Pursuant to a pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to suspend all confinement in excess of 24 months.
6/28/2018	AIT Bn, SOI-W, Trng Cmd	At a Special Court-Martial at Camp Pendleton, California, a lance corporal was acquitted by a panel of officer and enlisted members of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance, wrongful use of a controlled substance, and wrongful distribution of a controlled substance.
6/28/2018	1st MLG	At a Special Court-Martial at Camp Pendleton, California, Master Gunnery Sergeant H. A. Rodriguez was convicted by a military judge of violating a lawful general order and adultery. The military judge sentenced the accused to reduction to E-7. The pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.
6/28/2018	I MIG, I MEF	At a Special Court-Martial at Camp Pendleton, California, Corporal E. E. Ramirez was convicted by a military judge of assault and unlawful entry. The military judge sentenced the accused to restriction for 60 days, 90 days hard labor without confinement, forfeitures of \$600.00 per month for two months, and reduction to E-2. The pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

6/29/2018	MALS-31, MAG-31, 2dMAW	At a General Court-Martial at Parris Island, South Carolina, Captain T. C. Klesel was convicted by a military judge of sexual assault of a child, sexual abuse of a child, sexual abuse of a child, sexual abuse of a child by communicating indecent communication, attempting to receive child pornography, and receiving and possessing child pornography. The military judge sentenced the accused to 28 years confinement and a dismissal. Pursuant to a pre-trial agreement, the convening authority agreed to suspend all confinement in excess of eight years.
