SUBJECT: Evaluation of DoD Compliance at Active Sites Conducting Open Burning or Open Detonation of Excess Conventional Ammunition and Explosives in the U.S. and Its Territories (Project No. D2018-D00SPO-0178.000)

We plan to begin the subject evaluation in August 2018. The project was initiated by Congressional request. Our objective is to evaluate DoD compliance with relevant environmental and related laws, inter-agency and municipal agreements, and policy at sites where DoD conducts or conducted open burning of excess conventional ammunition and explosives at locations in the United States and its Territories. We will also evaluate DoD oversight of contractors performing open burning at those sites.

We will perform the evaluation at select active DoD ammunition plants or other facilities where open burning or open detonation are conducted to dispose of excess conventional ammunition and explosives. We will also collect data about inactive sites where open burning or open detonation were performed in the past from relevant DoD agencies, organizations, and databases. We will consider suggestions from management on additional or revised objectives or for future evaluations.
