Major General Tracy A. Thompson assumed duties as Deputy Commanding General (Support) / U.S. Army Reserve, U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command on March 6, 2017.

Mission: Assists and advises the Commanding General TRADOC with the goal of achieving full integration of the U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) in planning, staffing, resourcing, and executing TRADOC missions across the DOTMLPF development process. As the TRADOC DCG-USAR, he provides oversight of all Army Reserve capabilities and equities to achieve a seamless link between TRADOC and the Army Reserve. Also coordinates directly with the Department of the Army (DA), the Chief, Army Reserve (CAR) and USAR Training Commands.

Major General Thompson enlisted in 1981 and was commissioned from OCS at Fort Benning in 1984. He was an Engineer Platoon Leader, Construction Officer, Executive Officer and Company Commander. Broadening assignments include Observer/Controller and Inspector General. He commanded the 462d Transportation Battalion in Trenton/Fort Dix, New Jersey and the 436th Transportation Battalion, (Movement Control), Camp Arifjan, Kuwait. He also commanded the 300th Sustainment Brigade, Grand Prairie, Texas and the 420th Engineer Brigade in Bryan, Texas. Before assuming his current position, he commanded the 412th Theater Engineer Command in Vicksburg, Mississippi.

Major General Thompson has a B.S. in Economics from the University of Wisconsin, Madison and a Juris Doctor (JD) from the Northern Illinois University College of Law. He is a graduate of the United States Army Command and General Staff College, United States Army War College in Carlisle, Pennsylvania and CAPSTONE. Major General Thompson's awards include the Legion of Merit and Bronze Star Medal.
