As the daughter of a founding member of an organization called the Mexican American Business and Professional Women's Club, a "laboratory for leadership" for Hispanic women, Garcia benefited from its mission of mentorship and later became its vice president. Garcia later developed an award-winning, six-month leader development program for its members and a national award winning program designed to keep the Hispanic women of the club informed on political issues and processes.

During Garcia's first position with the Department of Defense, she organized an educational volunteer program where co-workers volunteered an hour per week to read to grade school children. The program grew from 350 to 1,000 volunteers and won a commendation from President George H.W. Bush for community service.

Recently, Garcia was instrumental in the success of students from all levels of education assigned to the Department of Defense Workforce Recruitment Program for College Students with Disabilities. She is also regularly asked to speak Women's History Month events.

On September 6, Garcia will be presented her award at the 9th Annual National LATINA Symposiumin Washington D.C.
