



AFW2 PROGRAM MISSION

Every month, the Air Force determines approximately 106 Airmen are seriously wounded, ill or injured and require personalized care and support through enrollment in the **Air Force Wounded Warrior Program (AFW2)**.

AFW2 provides well-coordinated, personalized support to the Total Force Recovering Service Members (RSM), Caregivers, and their families.

The **Air Reserve Component (ARC) Cell**, a support program under AFW2, provides personnel support and non-medical care management for AFW2 National Guard/Reserves enrollees and their families, as they navigate through their continuum of care either back to their respective units or to the civilian community.

Providing personalized management, care and transition support to seriously wounded, ill and injured Airmen is not only required by law, it is the right thing to do!

AFW2 ARC CELL

The **Air Reserve Component (ARC) Cell** are centrally located at HQ AFPC, JBSA Randolph, TX. They provide reach-back support to the Recovery Care Coordinators (RCCs) who are the “boots on the ground” at 42 locations.

ARC Cell is manned by individuals who serve as Subject Matter Experts that work in tandem with the RCCs as they resolve personnel and transition issues such as LODs, INCAP Pay, MEDCON orders, out-processing, retired pay, and more.

The ARC Cell works daily with NGB, ARPC, and AFRC.

ELIGIBILITY



Very Seriously, Seriously wounded, ill or injured on the morning casualty report or by a Medical Authority



Airmen with highly complex medical conditions (service connected or in-the-line of duty) confirmed by a Medical Authority



Airmen diagnosed w/ service connected or in-the-line of duty PTSD, TBI or MST, and are under consideration or referred to MEB



Purple Heart Recipients



Air Reserve Component (ARC): Same criteria as above to include validation that injury/illness was service connected and in-the-line of duty and/or while on active orders or medical continuation orders

RCCs

The primary mission of the Recovery Care Coordinator (RCC) is to facilitate, monitor, and ensure access to care and resources for seriously or very seriously wounded, ill and injured (WII) Airmen and their families.

RCCs allow for a smooth transition from immediate hospital recovery to long-term adaptability and care.

RCCs also educate and guide Airmen through the first four phases of the Continuum of Care and always serves as the local area referral expert for Airmen in need.

FIND YOUR RCC

Contact the RCC nearest you for an assessment if you think you meet the eligibility criteria to enroll in the Air Force Wounded Warrior Program.

RCCs places of performance include ANG and AFR units. Contact a RCC for a Mission Briefing to learn more about AFW2.
