When I was in New York the other day I had a conversation with Major Yardley, in which I mentioned the receipt of the enclosed messages in German, supposed to have been sent by the Japanese General Staff to the General Staff at Vladivostok.

Major Yardley expressed doubt concerning the fact that these messages were originally encoded from the German.

It is believed that the messages, with their translations, will be of interest to him.
