MEMORANDUM FOR THE CHIEF OF STAFF.

Subject: Transportation to Europe and Return via U.S.A. Transport.

I. Papers accompanying.
None.

II. The problem presented.
Shall transportation by U.S.A. Transport to Europe and return be supplied certain War Department civilian employees.

III. Facts bearing upon the problem.

1. Mr. H. O. Yardley, civilian employee, G-2, employed in a confidential position, has requested leave of absence on account of ill health. He has rendered and is rendering confidential service of such value to the government as to make it most desirable to aid him in the recovery of his health.

2. He wishes to go to Europe and return on an Army Transport, accompanied by his wife. In the interests of the government, his sailing from the United States on a transport leaving April 8, 1922, is desirable.

IV. Opinion of G-2.

That transportation should be furnished as set forth in the following paragraph.

V. Action directed.

That the Quartermaster General be directed to furnish transportation, first class, to Mr. H. O. Yardley and wife, to Antwerp on the transport sailing from New York April 8, 1922; and that in the event of any transport sailing from Europe to America after April 23, 1922, similar return transportation be supplied thereon.
