The FRIEND OF CUBA desires that on Election Day several cablegrams be sent to the Legation, - one at three o'clock after the elections are over stating whether they were held without disorders of any kind, and others at nine, ten and eleven that night, at which hours he judges the result of the Cuban elections should be known in Havana. He, together with several friends, will wait in the club to receive the news because he does not wish to retire that night until he knows the result of his law as applied by us. He thinks that the results can be known the same night and wishes to recommend that they be published by means of search light signals as they are received. He desires an answer as to whether it will be possible to send the cablegrams.
