SUBJECT: Radio Intercept Station.

TO: The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department,
Washington, D. C.

1. Receipt is acknowledged of your letter G-2/65-1A-7, December 7th, re Radio Intercepts. The Signal Officer, these headquarters, is cooperating in every way, and will be in a position to intercept all messages sent by Station RP7, both manually and by means of an automatic receiving device. Messages intercepted will be forwarded as received.

2. As a matter of interest, the Radio Supervisor, this District, representing the Department of Commerce, called on the Signal Officer a few days ago for information regarding this station. He has been heard on the air, and is not listed as an amateur station by these call letters. It is the opinion of the Signal Officer that he is a regularly listed amateur station under another call letter, and uses the RP7 only in calling RK3 and one transpacific station.
