 - The review area is comprised entirely of dry land (i.e., there are no waters or water features, including wetlands, of any kind in the entire review area). Rationale: The approximately 3-acre building envelope is part of a larger 13.46 acre parcel adjacent to Teton Creek. A wetland delineation of the building envelope was performed by the property owner's agent showing that the site consists of uplands. The area, while part of Teton Creek's riparian corridor, is underlain by cobbles and gravels that drain quickly given slope. While the general area may have been wetter in the past, agricultural diversions since settlement have diverted most of the flow from this section of Teton Creek, except during the early run-off period in the spring/early summer.

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was conducted during a dry period. However the data sheets included with the delineation shows that the site was considered upland because of lack of hydric soil in addition to lack of hydrology. This supports the assertion that the site is upland in spite of conducting the delineation during a dry period.
