MEMORANDUM FOR Commanders of Units Assigned or Attached to USAREUR,  
Under the Operational Control of USAREUR, or Supported by USAREUR

SUBJECT: USAREUR Policy on Issuing U.S. Forces Certificates of License to Operate  
Privately Owned Vehicles in Poland (AE Cmd Memo 2020-002)

This memorandum expires in 2 years.

### 1. References.

a. Agreement Between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the Republic of Poland on the Status of the Armed Forces of the United States of America in the Territory of the Republic of Poland, 11 December 2009.

b. Implementing Arrangement Between the Government of the Republic of Poland and the Government of the United States of America to the Agreement Between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the Republic of Poland on the Status of the Armed Forces of the United States of America in the Territory of the Republic of Poland Concerning the Certificate of Entitlement to Operate Private Motor Vehicles, 20 May 2013.

c. USEUCOM Directive 45-7, Country Regulations.

d. [AE Regulation 190-1](#), Driver and Vehicle Requirements and the Installation Traffic Code for the U.S. Forces in Germany.

**2. Overview.** In accordance with Article 11 of [reference 1a](#) and Article 1 of [reference 1b](#), U.S. military authorities may issue bilingual U.S. Forces Certificates of License that will be valid for operating private motor vehicles in the Republic of Poland.

**3. General Guidelines.** The USAREUR Registry of Motor Vehicles (RMV) will begin issuing U.S. Forces Certificates of License to members of the force, members of the civilian component, and dependents stationed in Poland.

a. Identified POCs of units assigned or attached to, under the operational control of, or supported by USAREUR are responsible for sending an applicant's completed packet to the Area Support Group – Poland (ASG–Poland), 21st Sustainment Command. ASG–Poland will send completed packets to the RMV Licensing Office for processing.

b. In accordance with USEUCOM Directive 45-7 ([ref 1c](#)), the USAREUR Provost Marshal is delegated the authority to approve the detailed procedures and the forms

necessary to implement this policy in accordance with references [1a](#) and [d](#), and to codify the requirements in a published standing operating procedure (SOP).

c. The SOP incorporates by reference [AE Regulation 190-1 \(ref 1d\)](#) and extends its applicability to Poland. Portions of this regulation are punitive. Violations of these provisions may subject offenders to nonjudicial or judicial action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice. Violations of these provisions may also subject individuals to adverse administrative action or adverse civilian misconduct action.

**4. Review.** The USAREUR RMV is responsible for reviewing and updating this memorandum until the policy established herein is incorporated into [AE Regulation 190-1](#) or into another appropriate regulation.
