The DoD Office of Inspector General will conduct an evaluation of Military Criminal Investigative Organization's (MCIO) Major Procurement Fraud (MPF) programs.

The objective of this evaluation is to determine whether the major procurement fraud investigations comply with Department, Service, and MCIO policy.

We will conduct site visits to MCIO Headquarters (HQ) and MPF HQ to interview leadership, management, and other personnel. We may identify additional site visits and or interviews during the evaluation. In lieu of physical office visits, we may conduct these visits and associated interviews virtually.
