7/8/2020	HqBn, MCBH	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a panel of members acquitted a Marine of all charges and specifications.
7/8/2020	Hq&HqRon, MCAS Miramar	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, a military judge convicted Staff Sergeant A. S. Poludniak of failure to obey an other lawful order. The military judge sentenced the accused to a reprimand.
7/10/2020	MARCENT	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a panel of members acquitted a Marine of all charges and specifications.
7/10/2020	WWBn-E, WWReg	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Sergeant C. S. Davis of wrongful use of a controlled substance. The military judge sentenced the accused to 30 days of confinement, 30 days of restriction, reduction to E-1, and a reprimand.
7/10/2020	SptBn, II MIG, II MEF	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal L. A. Hebenstreit, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of conspiracy, violation of a lawful general order, communicating a threat, battery, and burglary. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to 80 days of confinement, forfeiture of \$1,155 for 3 months, and reduction to E-1.
7/10/2020	CLB 1, CLR 1, 1stMLG	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a panel of members convicted Sergeant J. L. Carter of maltreatment and making false official statements. The members sentenced the accused to 25 days of confinement, 30 days of restriction, and reduction to E-2.
7/16/2020	MAG-14, 2d MAW	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, a panel of members convicted Private First Class J. H. Boyd of breaking restriction. The accused elected sentencing by the military judge who sentenced the accused to reduction to E-1.

7/16/2020	MAG-11, 3dMAW	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, a military judge convicted Corporal J. L. Dohner, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of indecent recording. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to 12 months of confinement, reduction to E-1, and a bad conduct discharge.
7/17/2020	2dMarDiv	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a panel of members convicted Lance Corporal T. Lhakpa of wrongful use of a controlled substance. The members sentenced the accused to 2 months of confinement, forfeiture of \$1,100 per month for 4 months, 60 days of restriction, and reduction to E-1.
7/21/2020	2d MAW	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Staff Sergeant J. M. Bernal, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of signing false documents, making a false official statement, larceny of military property, and obstructing justice. Consistent with the pre-trial agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to 7 months of confinement, reduction to E-1, and a bad conduct discharge.
7/22/2020	HqSptBn, SOI-E, Trng Cmd	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Private First Class O. E. Connolly, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of unauthorized absence and wrongful use of a controlled substance. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to 114 days of confinement and reduction to E-1.
7/23/2020	MWSD-24, MAG-24, 1ST MAW	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a military judge convicted Corporal J. E. Christner, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of dereliction resulting in death, negligently damaging military property of a value exceeding \$1,000.00, and reckless driving. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to 3 months of confinement, forfeiture of \$1,000 per month for 3 months, and reduction to E-1.

7/31/2020	II MEF	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal T. L. Barber, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of wrongful distribution and use of a controlled substance and reckless driving. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to 10 months of confinement and a bad conduct discharge.
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
