ACCOUNT OF AN INDISCREET CONVERSATION IN A HOSPITAL WARD (1945)

From: SAN FRANCISCO

To: MOSCOE

To VIKTOR. [1]

In a conversation with me on 28th February 1945 "VOLKOV" [11] reported the following:

On 24th February he found the Consul-General, Comrade VASIL'EV[111], and the head [ZAVEDUYUShehLJ] of the Cipher Office[SShO], Comrade FEDOSEEV, discussing the text of a cipher telegram in a hospital ward (Comrade VASIL'EV is ill and is in hospital). On leaving the hospital with the Consul-General's wife "VOLKOV" questioned her as to why they always worked so freely. The latter answered: "Previously they used to read the cipher telegrams, but now they have invented a new method - elucidating everything by currespondence". It has been established that Comrade VASIL'EV receives American citizens of Russian origin in the ward and tells them whom they should select for the Russo-American Institute. He indicated to ARNAUTOV[1v] who should be voted for and gave
