1. In connection with the winding up of the Military Mission of the USSR in the U.K. all personnel of the Mission are to be recalled to MOSCOW by [C% 1st October] with the exception of the following officers, transferred to the Military Attaché's [VAT] APPARAT in the U.K. [1 group unrecovered] [C% appointments]:

Colonels GORSHKOV[iii] and FASTOVShchUK [iv] - Senior Assistants;
 Lt. Colonels STEMASOV [v]; and PUDOV[vi]-Assistants;
 Captain SHIROBKOV[vii] - Chief clerk;
 Senior Lieutenant KRUTIKOV[viii] - Cipher clerk;
 Senior Lieutenant NIKONOV[ix] - Chauffeur;
 Junior Lieutenant RYABCHIKOV[x] - Cadet guard [KURSANT OKHRANY];
 Lieutenant. PATOVA[xi] - Interpreter;
 Junior Lieutenant YAZYNINA[xii] - Interpreter;
 Radio operators - PANFILOV[xiii], KUDRYAVTSEV[xiv], ZAVARSKAYA[xv].

 - [ii] SHARAPOV ✓ : Major-General Andrej Rodinovich SHARAPOV, Deputy Head of the Soviet Military Mission (in the UK December 1943-28th March 1946).
 - [iii] Colonel GORSHKOV ✓ : Colonel Yakov Petrovich GORSHKOV, (in the UK 3rd June 1945-16th July 1950: was Acting Military and Air Attaché in May 1947).
 - [iv] Colonel FASTOVShchIK ✓ : Colonel Nikolaj Petrovich FASTOVShchIK, Soviet Assistant Military Attaché (in the UK 28th April 1945 - 16th April 1947)
 - [v] Lt. Colonel STEMASOV ✓ : Lt. Colonel Stepan Ivanovich STEMASOV, of the Soviet Military Attaché's office (arrived in the UK on 9th March 1944).
 - [vi] Lt. Colonel PUDOV ✓ : Lt. Colonel Viktor Mikhajlovich PUDOV, Soviet Assistant Military Attaché (in the UK 18th December 1944 - 26th August 1950).

- [vii] Captain SHIROBOKOV ✓ : Captain Grigoriĭ Georgievich SHIROBOKOV, clerk in the Soviet Military Mission and later secretary and interpreter to the Soviet Military Attaché (in the UK 27 May 1944 - 19 July 1949 and 10 May 1955 - 10 June 1955).
- [viii] Senior Lieutenant KRUTIKOV ✓ : Lieutenant Petr Nikolaevich KRUTIKOV cipher clerk in the Soviet Military Mission and later in the Military Attaché's office (in the UK 13 July 1944 - 27 February 1950).
- [ix] Senior Lieutenant NIKONOV ✓ : Pavel Petrovich NIKONOV, chauffeur/clerk in the Soviet Military Mission (in the UK 13 July 1943 - 1 May 1949).
- [x] Junior Lieutenant RYABCHIKOV: ✓ : Vladimir Aleksandrovich RYABCHIKOV, clerk/doorkeeper in the Soviet Military Mission and later clerk on the Military Attaché's staff (in the UK 17 March 1945 - 13 October 1948, 10 January 1949 - 15 July 1950).
- [xi] Lieutenant PATOVA ✓ : Nina Stepanovna PATOVA, clerk/typist in the Soviet Military Mission (in the UK 14 February 1944 - 22 June 1946).
- [xii] Junior Lieutenant YaZYNINA ✓ : Aleksandra Georgievna YaZYNINA, translator in the Soviet Military Mission (in the UK 27 June 1944 - 19 March 1946).
- [xiii] PANFILOV : Vladimir Sergeevich PANFILOV (or PANFILOV), Air Force officer, radio operator/clerk in the Soviet Military Mission (in the UK 28 June 1943 - 30 March 1949).

- [xiv] KUDRYaVTsEV ✓ : Lieutenant Ivan Sergeevich KUDRYaVTsEV, clerk/radio operator in the Soviet Military Mission (in the UK from 3 June 1944 and again from 23 August 1945 to 4 January 1946)
- [xv] ZAVARSKAYa ✓ : Anna Nikolaevna ZAVARSKAYa, secretary/clerk in the Soviet Military Mission (in the UK 14 July 1944 - 23 November 1946).
- [xvi] House No. 16 ✓ : Presumably 16 Kensington Palace Gardens, LONDON W8.
