handed in a report about his talk with MOORE on 15th October to the organization [APPARAT]. In his report CLAUDE stated the following: Stuart Henry MOORE, 40 years old, residential address - 59, Rawson Street, HABERFIELD, SYDNEY. In April of this year he applied for a move to

after CHINA and the Soviet Union, instructions were given to delay consideration of his statement in order to make an additional check of all the information on him and to have a talk with him personally. On 17th July of this year I[b] talked with his guarantor[PORUCHITEL'] [c], John PINE[DZHON PAJN][v] (a minor employee of TOOTH & Co. Ltd. [TOOTH COM], the brewers[vi]). PINE told me that he met MOORE at the beginning of 1940 in a small provincial town in New South Wales where he was working in [1 group unrecovered] on the installation of petrol pumps; at the same time he was working elsewhere as a labourer in order to avoid being called up into the army. Before this he was head of the above mentioned department[OTDELENIE] of the firm. PINE did not have any contact with him after that until 1944. At this time he noticed that MOORE was showing interest in the Soviet Union. MOORE also told him that he was studying the Russian language. In his letters from the army MOORE wrote to PINE about his intention to join our movement after his return from the army. MOORE is married to a Catholic who works in the firm of "GRACE BROTHERS"[vii], where she is head of one of the departments[OTDEL]. PINE describes MOORE himself as an enthusiast who is persistently trying to convince the party of his truthfulness. Shortly before July of this year MOORE told him that he had been promoted to more important work. On 15th October MOORE, on the advice of P.[viii], called on me for a talk. During his talk with me, MOORE said that he was soon to be discharged from the army and apparently
