#### EXECUTIVE ORDER

DISCLOSURE OF MATERIALS CONCERNING THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY

By the authority vested in me as Prosident by the Constitution and the lews of the United States of America, and in order to ensure that the American people have expeditious access to materials concerning the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Dection 1. Definitions. For purposes of this order:

- (a) "Agency" means an Executive agency as defined in 5 U.S.C. § 552(1).
- (b) "Areassination material" means a record or particular information therein that pertains to the assessination of President John F. Kennedy or to the investigations thereof a. & that has not been made available to the public prior to the effective date of this order, but such term does not include:
- (1) any record or particular information therein that pertains solely to personnel matters or other administrative effects of the President's Commission on the Assassination of Fresident John F. Kennet/ (the Warren Commission) or any other agency;
- (2) any materials, including the autopsy materials, lonated by the Kennedy family to the Mational Archives pursuant to a deed of gift regulating access to those materials; or

- (1) any record or particular information therein the disclosure of which is prohibited by federal law.
- (c) "Accord" means a book, paper, map, photograph, machine readable material, or other documentary material, regardless of physical form or characteristics.
- (d) "Review Panel" means the Interegency Review Panel on John F. Kennedy Assassination Materials established by section 2(a) of this order.

# Assassination Materials.

- .(a) There is hereby established an interagency panel to be known as the "Interagency Review Panel on John F. Kennedy ...
  Ansassination Materials." The Review Panel shall be composed of the following officers or their designees:
  - (1) the Attorney General;
  - (2) the Secretary of State;
  - ()) the secretary of the Treasury:
  - (4) the Secretary of Defense:
  - (5) the Director of Central Intelligence:
- (6) the Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs.
- (b) Ine Review Panel Shail establish such procedures as as: recessary to discharge the duties assigned to it by section 4 up this order.

## Boc. J. Review and Disclosure by Agencies.

- (a) Within 90 days of the effective date of this order, outh agency shall review all essessination materials in its custody and shall, in accordance with section 6 of this order, discloss: such materials unless the agency determines in writing that such disclosure reasonably could be expected to:
- (1) threaten the national socurity, military defense, intelligence or law entorcement operations, or conduct of foreign relations of the United States;
- (2) constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy of a living person who has not agreed to such disclosura; or
  - (3) endanger the life or physical safety of any person.
- (b) If an agency has reasonable cause to believe that any assassination materials in its custody contain information that cridinated with another agency, it shall, before disclosing such materials, consult with the originating agency. Such materials shall, in accordance with section 6 of this order, be disclosed unless the originating agency objects in writing to such disclosure on the grounds specified in subsection (a) of this section.
- (c) All assessination materials not disclosed pursuant to aubsection. (a) or (b) of this section shall be made available to the review Panel.

- (a) The Review Panel shall review all essassination materials made available to it pursuant to section 3(c) of this order and shall, in accordance with mection 6 of this order, disclose such materials unless it determines that such disclose: would:

- (b) Upon completion of its review, the Review Panol shall submit to the President a report concerning its activities.
- Bee. 5. Redaction and Partial Disclosure. Sections 3 and 6 of this order shall be construed to require the disclosure of any particular assassination material after deleting the portions that would otherwise provent disclosure of such material.

see. 8. Judicial Review. Nothing in this order shall be construct to create any right or banefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable by a party against the United States, its spencies or instrumentalities, its officers or employees, or any other person.
