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WEEKLA BUSTE DAMAGE ASSESSMENT SUMMARY

INTRODUCT FOR

This report is a modification of bomb damage-related information obtained from GDRS and other Vietnamese communist ground forces communications: this SIGINT has been previously reported, primipally to the daily issues of the Southeast Asian SIGINT Summary, 3/0, /R296-68 through 3/0, The report consists of two sections, a narrative "highlight" and a tabular listing of bostile (U.S.) air activity directed against targets along the infiltration route in Laos. The "highlights" comment on trends and significant developments noted in Vietnamese communist ground forces reactions to these flights. The listing of air activity consists of four columns: column one provides the Date/lime of the reported activity with dashes used to indicate absence of a specific time; column two lists the type/Number of aircraft involved in the action; airmaft identifications are given as they appear in the traffic and are, of course, subject to error. Column three provides the type or nature of the Target and the last column identifies the nature of the activity, buttressed with brick remarks when necessary or possible.

LAOS

reveal some success on the part of Rear Services-associated ground forces in combacting the forays of hostile aircraft. Air activity during this period, as reflected in CDRS messages, has been concentrated in the areas of the Routes 912 and 911 with Talle (17-13N 106-08E), Ra Toc (17-07N 106-03E), Coc Mac (AKA Ban Kok Nok, 17-02N 105-59E), Lum Bum (17-03N 105-57E) and Ban Kha (17-00N: 105-57E) prominently mentioned. Although there is limited SIGINI evidence of shootdowns, the principal success has evidently been in the further development of simulated or dummy installations that have served to divert air strikes. There are also indications that AAA positions, especially those of the 22rd Battalion, have been shifted.

Messages concerning simulated installations have been observed since at least early November with references to the construction of a constructions, this, and various structures, as well as the use of lights, fires etc. to enhance the effect of realism. One message, dated 22 November, from the 22nd AAA Battalion, stated that each unit was to have one deception cell to "lute" the enemy and thus attract enemy fire and protect construction forces. More recent messages, dated 10 and 11 December, have stated that false targets have been the object of nine B-52 strikes and as many as

In a further development relating to the 591st, a 12 December message from BIBH IRAM is instructed the 22md AAA Battalion to send personnel to the 391st to study the use of the 23-mm artillery piece; personnel were to take their military equipment with them and also their ration cards for the remainder of December. There were several messages on 12 and 13 December that reported shooting down bostile aircraft and one message reported the belicopter rescue of an American pilot.

Available evidence indicates that all action occurred in the present of Parallia probability of the probability of the first the purities with Route 913 studbuard of possibly kilometer marker (KM) 97. The rescue operation was reported in a Rear Service message, transmitted during the afternoon of 13 December, which also reported on strikes and recommaissance flights in the vicinity of Coc Mac (AKA Ban Kok Nak, 17-02N 105-59E), Lum Bum (17-03N 105-57E) and KM's 62 and 7, implying the rescue eccurred in the same area. The shootdown apparently occurred sometime prior to the mean hour; available portions of the

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message do not identify the type of aircraft shot down. Another shootdown was reported on this date, occurring in the same area (No Sa Kir, 16.59N 1.06-01E), in a message originated by an element of the 22nd AAA Battalion. In this instance, however, the pilot was killed by exploding bombs and the aircraft was totally destroyed, making salvage impossible. The message that had reported the rescue of the American pilot made a garbled reference to two compasses, one parachute and one map, indicating salvage had been possible in this instance. Another message from the 22nd AAA Battalion, transmitted on the 12th, congratulated Company 1 on hitting an aircraft and setting it on fire. Inasmuch as this company has been located recently in the area of KM's 91-97 on Route 911 it appears that this shootdown took place in the same general area as the activity of the 13th.

A message of 4 December had stated that the artillery tractors were to be used to deploy the battalion's firepower in accordance with the "group's message". On 7 December, a message originated by the same individual who had sent the message of the 4th stated that the deployment had been completed as follows: Company 103: two guns at Len Da (17-IIN 106-09E), two at KM 97, three at Coc Mac; Company 1: four gums at KM 93; Company 3: three gums at KM 82, two guns and three vehicles were at Lom (16-45N 105-56E). The message added that Company 3 had two guns that had been struck by enemy fire and one that would not eject shells. Personnel at Company 3 were reportedly concerned about their ability to carry out their mission. The message also made a reference to the need to maintain secrecy regarding Company 2's cransfer to the 591st (Engineer Regiment). In a further development relating to the 591st, a 12 December message from BINH TRAM 32 instructed the 22rd AAA Battalion to send personnel to the 591st to study the use of the 23-mm artillery piece; personnel were to take their military equipment with them and also their ration cards for the remainder of December. The message further stated that care should be taken to insure that there was an instructor capable of inspecting the B-57 that Company 103 shot down "last night" to see if it was the B-57 shot down by the 18th AAA Battalion.

There were several messages on 12 and 13 December that reported shooting down hostile aircraft and one message reported the helicopter rescue of an American pilot.

Available evidence indicates that all action occurred in the vicinity of Roure 911, probably from the junction with Route 912 southward to possibly kilometer marker (KM) 97.
