



MISSION

JTF-SD, in unified action with mission partners, deters aggression, defends capabilities, and defeats adversaries throughout the conflict continuum in order to gain and maintain space superiority in the U.S. Space Command area of responsibility.

HOW WE WIN

By providing America and her allies the most capable and versatile space warfighting organization in the world, executed by the most formidable space warriors, armed with superior domain understanding, and readiness to employ space superiority capabilities at the time and place of our choosing.

THREE CORE FUNCTIONS:

SPACE DOMAIN AWARENESS. Effectively identify, characterize and understand any factor, passive or active, associated with the space domain that could affect space operations and thereby impact the security, economy or environment of our nation.

INDICATIONS AND WARNING. Conduct 24/7 space and counter-space system monitoring, identifying threatening and non-threatening activities to issue timely warning to satellite owners and operators.

<u>SPACE SUPERIORITY.</u> When called, protect and defend U.S. and allied interests in space permitting the conduct of operations at the time and place of our choosing.

Additionally, the JTF-SD executes campaign and contingency planning; exercises, experiments and wargames; capability integration and commercial partnering to better understand our area of responsibility.

The JTF-SD, and its National Space Defense Center, provide unprecedented unity of effort with the Department of Defense, Intelligence Community

JTF-SD Commander's Vision

COMMANDER'S INTENT

PURPOSE: JTF-SD will ensure freedom of action for U.S. and coalition assets in the space area of operations across the spectrum of conflict and, when necessary, deny the adversary the same.

KEY TASKS:

- » Plan, prepare and conduct Space Superiority Operations.
- » Understand the space AOR through dominant Space Domain Awareness (includes space situational awareness and intelligence) to provide indications and warning.
- » Develop/enhance partnerships to integrate and synchronize actions for unity of effort across the Whole of Government.
- » Develop and integrate doctrine and tactics,

- techniques and procedures to enhance space as a warfighting domain.
- » Recruit, train, develop, promote, retain and care for a uniquely qualified workforce to achieve our space superiority mission.
- » Influence the development of, and integrate future space superiority systems, to include mission command systems, across the JTF-SD enterprise.
- Define and request the authorities needed to conduct space superiority missions.

END STATE:

A well-disciplined team, properly manned, trained and equipped with the necessary authorities to conduct space superiority operations; has secured unfettered access and freedom to operate in the space AOR for the United States and our strategic partners, and when necessary, deny adversaries the same.
