- The review area is comprised entirely of dry land (i.e., there are no waters or water features, including wetlands, of any kind in the entire review area). Rationale: See June 8, 2021, wetland delineation and supporting data prepared by Kagel Environmental for the site. The report shows that during sampling in the early growing season (first part of June) the site does not exhibit hydrology or hydric soils. A portion of the site does appear to be inundated during snowmelt, prior to the onset of the growing season. Inundation during snowmelt would explain the mix of wetland/upland vegetation recorded by Kagel Environmental. Hydrology not persisting into the early growing season explains the lack of hydric soils and redoximorphic features in the soil as the site likely drains quickly once the ground thaws.
