## MONTHAUTH FUR THE SECRETARY OF DEFERSE

HULTET: Alleviation of overcrowding upon initial occupation of INA Descriptions Building at Fort Heads

1. The plans for the Mational Security Agency Operations Muliding, now being constructed at Fort George G. Meade, Maryland, more initiated alcost five years age. These plans had been carefully developed to provide adequate spade for the operations of the Armed Forces Security Agency. Mince that time, NOCHD No. 9 (Hewised) and NSC 165 have been instead, establishing the Mational Security Agency. The scope of responsibility and the sparstions of this successor to the Armed Forces Security Agency Have Baen greatly increased in the fields of both COHINT and COMENC during this five-year period.

A. The plans for the incility at Fort Heade called for gross space of 1.4 million square feet; about 1.1 million square feet were to be allocated for sperational use. During development of the plans, this 1.1 million square feet of operational space was further decreased to 1.05 million square feet by the architectural necessity of increasing space illocated to such service facilities as more elevators and escalstars, wider corridors, increased transformer sepacity, and increased tofict facilities. Netwithstanding this reduction, the remaining usable space that space was considered apple in 1951 to accorrest the total work force and to ellow for some expansion. Installation Deployment Flan. Completion of this Flan in FT-58 will immease the amount of intercept by more than 60 per cent. In order to process properly this staggering volume of traffic, I will undoubtedly require more people. This is evident from the fact that we are almost up to our furrently authorized allowance and are still unable to process fully all the material we receive.

3. I consider it manifestly unwise to initiate operations at the New site under crowded conditions. This would effectively preclude any meeded expansion or delay it until additions to the building could be dematructed. The CONSEC production element at the Navel Security Station may be considered an entity in itself. Its separation from the staff elements at Fort Heade would not adversely affect the direction, planning, and guidance of the CONSEC effort, whereas its retention at the Navel Security Station would serve in some degree to disperse the vital CLASEC eperation.

4. In view of the situation discussed above, I now plan to retain sufficient space at the Naval Security Station to accommodate the CO-ISEC sativities which do not require collocation with NSA Readquarters for efficient operation. I have agreed to inform the Navy by 30 June 1955 of the space at the Naval Security Station which will be required by MSA and will itemize for them the buildings to be retained.
