I. REDESIGNATION

The 6969th Armed Forces Security Squadron was reorganized as of 1 May 1953, and redesignated the 6969th Support Squadron.

II. SHOE SHINE SERVICE

A shoe shine stand has been established for military personnel in the waiting room of the Station barber shop in Building 7 (directly opposite Room 7159). Hours of operation are as follows:

0900 - 1300 Monday through Friday (except holidays)

Price of shine is 15¢ and no tipping is permitted.

III. ESTABLISHMENT OF CREDIT UNION

1. The NSA Federal Employees' Credit Union has been organized by civilian employees to promote systematic savings among members and to provide them with a ready source of loans, at low rates, for provident or productive purposes. It is a private, voluntary association and is managed and controlled by the members under jurisdiction of the Federal Security Agency, Bureau of Federal Credit Unions. This Agency assumes no responsibility whatsoever in connection with the operation of the Credit Union. Membership drives, and the collection of dues, assessments, membership fees or funds for the Credit Union will be made outside of working hours. For this purpose, lunch periods are considered outside of working hours.

2. An applicant may qualify for membership by paying the entrance fee of 25 cents. After paying the entrance fee, a member may apply for a loan at a low rate of interest, subject to approval of the Credit Committee, by subscribing for at least one \$5.00 share and paying at least 25 cents

toward its purchase price. A \$5.00 share entitles the holder to participate in dividends issued at the end of each calendar year.

3. Membership is open to personnel of NSA, SIGPO, ASA and the 7005th Area Service Unit. Trainees in the NSA School become eligible for membership on assignment to their respective positions in operating elements.

4. The Credit Union office is located in Room 3, Cafeteria Basement, AHS, and is open for business every Friday between 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM, and between 4:30 and 5:00 PM.

5. Further information may be obtained from the personnel in organizations listed below each Friday between 11:30 AM and Noon.
