In an article which appeared in the Washington Sunday Star on November 2, 1969, entitled "Aboard the USS Pueblo the Day it was Seized", it was stated?

"Someone somewhere at some time -- the Navy won't say who, when or how -- intercepted a message at 1210 from the SO-1 (the North Korean subchaser) to shore:

The name of the target is GER-2. I judge it to be a reconnaissance ship. It is American guys. It does not appear that there are weapons and it is a hydrographic mapping ship. The SO-1 gave her position: 39° 25' N., 127° 56' E., 16.8 miles from shore."

Was such a message intercepted? If so, by whom? Was USS Pueblo informed of that intercepted message?

If so, at what time was USS Pueblo informed?

If not, what, if anything, was done with that intercepted message?

Finding of Fact #224, page 37, Court of Inquiry report, reflects that at "230310Z SC-35 reported position at 39-26N/127-53E (Exh. 19)". Was the position report the only information in that message? *yes*

Were any other messages of the North Korean ships/intercepted on January 23 prior to seizure of the USS Pueblo? *first*

If so, what was the text of those messages?

Was Pueblo informed of those messages?

Was anybody informed of those messages?
