According to information from the Polish Military Attaché [i] (a letter) -
the SAUSAGE-DEALERS[KOLBASNIK][ii] here [4 groups unrecovered][~~as~~ as follows:]

[The next 617 groups contain a report giving the location
and strength of Red Army formations. This intelligence
appears to come from German sources.]

Comments: [i] The Polish Military Attaché at this time was Major Feliks
BRZESKIENSKI, who had been in post since 1939. By the end of
February 1942 he had been given the cover-name STÅS (STOCKHOLM
No. 394 of 27th February 1942 - 3/NKF/T1636).

[ii] SAUSAGE-DEALERS: Germans. According to GUENKO the codeword
for GERMANY in Military Attaché traffic was
"KOLBASITA", i.e. Sausage-land. KOLBASNIK is
also an old Russian slang word for a German.

[iii] AKASTO: Col. N. I. NIKITUSHEV, Soviet Military Attaché in
STOCKHOLM.
