"MAZhOR"[11] [4 groups unrecovered] March 1944 in a report writes that KUZNETSOVA[111] is still hiding in PORTLAND. "VITALIJ"[iv] is not taking part in the search for K. K-13[v], E-14[vi] and "IGOR'"[vii] have been coopted for the search.

"MAZhOR" revealed the following compromising information about "VITALLJ":
