held by the Permanent Secretary, Frederick SHEDDEN[a]. The document found its way into the "NOOK[ZAKOULOK] "[iii] where it is to be studied and it will be possible to get hold of it once again in the middle of the month.

- In reply to your No. 1305[b]. The information sent by us about ASHBY's [EShBI][iv] trip to VLADIVOSTOK is at present being rechecked by KLOD through his friends in the "POOK". As the technique of KLOD's meetings with the latter is rather complicated and takes a long time, the clarification of this matter has been somewhat delayed. It is also possible that the friends will need some time to find the required information.
- Nothing in KLOD's behaviour has changed. In spite of the fact that he recently suffered a great personal sorrow (his wife died), he is still full of fight, [2 groups unrecovered]. In connection with the events in CANADA he declared: "We must not become inured to these provocations; we are always on the alert and nothing is going to confuse us." He reports that his friends in the NOOK are also in good spirits and are behaving with great caution. They have recently learnt that a certain Captain MITCHELL[HITCHEL'][v] is working in the Department as a representative of counter-intelligence. So far they
