## Chapter 1: DTS Naming Conventions

Each DTS organization can have up to 20 alphanumeric positions with the first two entries designated at the DoD level. The DoD Component determines for itself how to assign the remaining 18 positions. Beneath the DoD organization, every organization is subordinate to another, and to clearly show the organization hierarchy, each organization's name begins with the name of the organization it is subordinate to. For example, the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations has the organization name DN11. It is subordinate to the US Navy, which has the organization name "DN" and is itself subordinate to the DoD, which has the organization name "D".

Table Q-1 shows the manner in which DTS builds organization names.

\*The more levels in an organization hierarchy, the more maintenance is required as personnel join and leave organizations. As a best practice, the total organizational structure should include levels only down to the level where travel funds are allocated or travel costs are managed.

Organization access:

- Access to the "D" organization permits DoD-level travel managers to access data from across the Department.
- Access to a Component (e.g., organization name "DA") allows Component-level travel managers to access data across an entire service, or for all defense agencies or joint commands.
- Access to level 3 organizations allows travel managers at the major organization - level to access data for an entire major organization, Defense Agency, or joint or unified command.
- Access to lower-level organizations allow travel managers to access data at any desired organizational level.

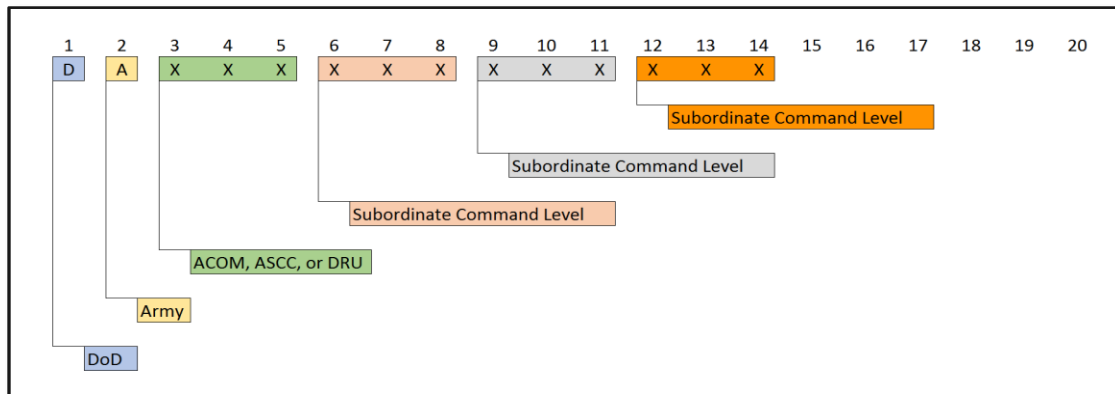


Figure Q-1: Army Organization Naming Convention

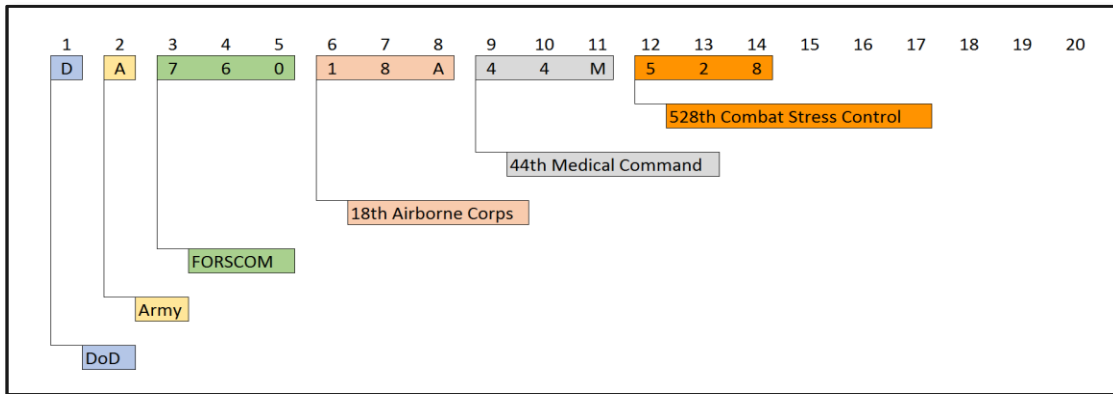


Figure Q-2: Army Organization Example

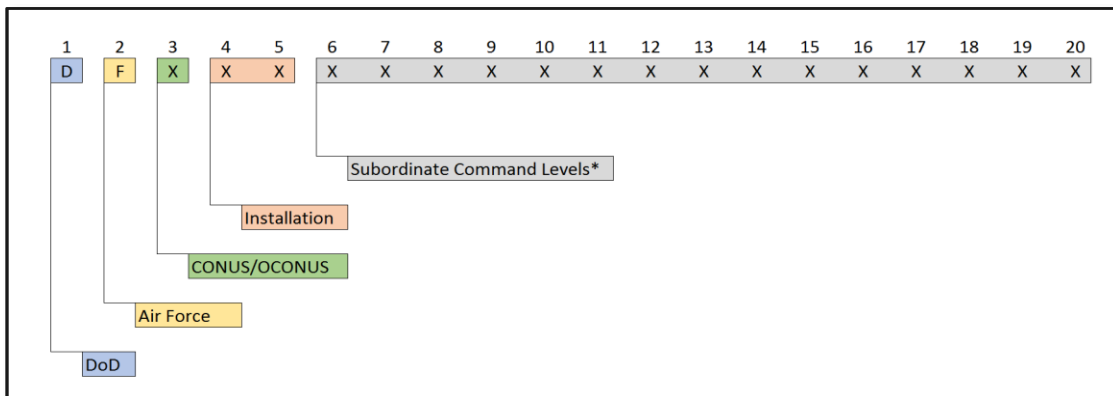


Figure Q-3: Air Force Organization Naming Convention

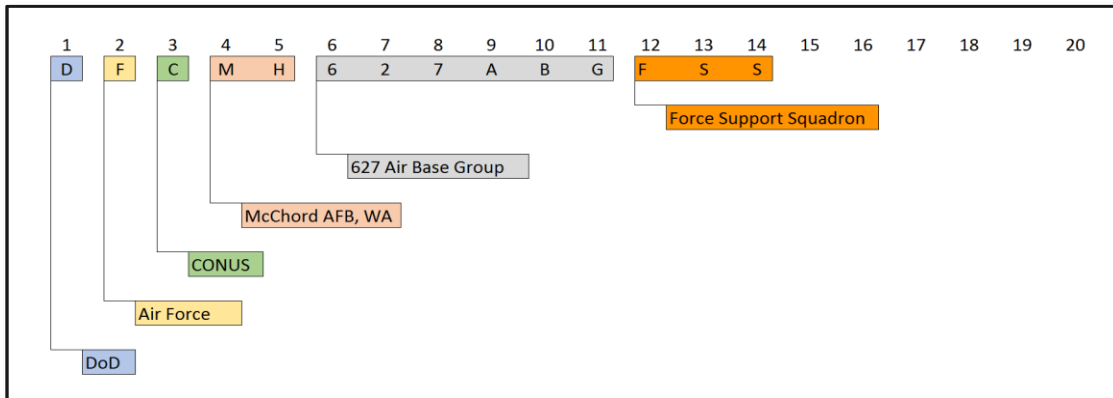


Figure Q-4: Air Force Organization Naming Example

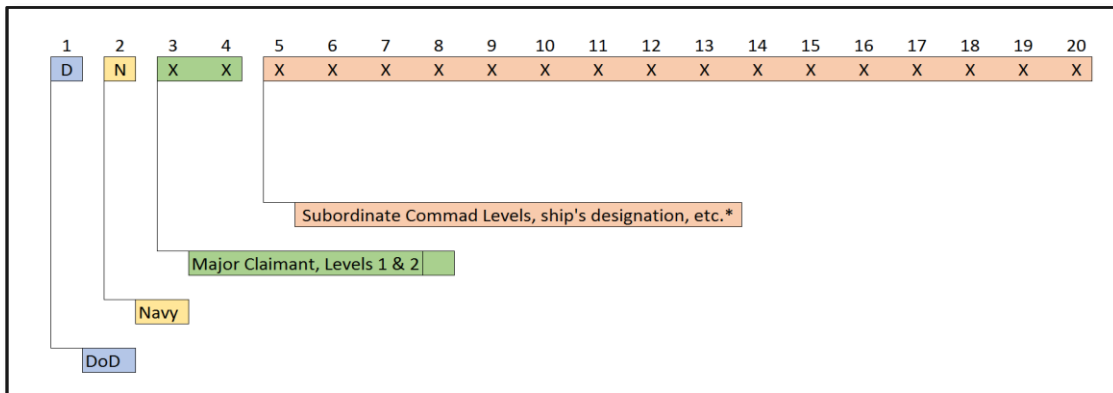


Figure Q-5: Navy Organization Naming Convention

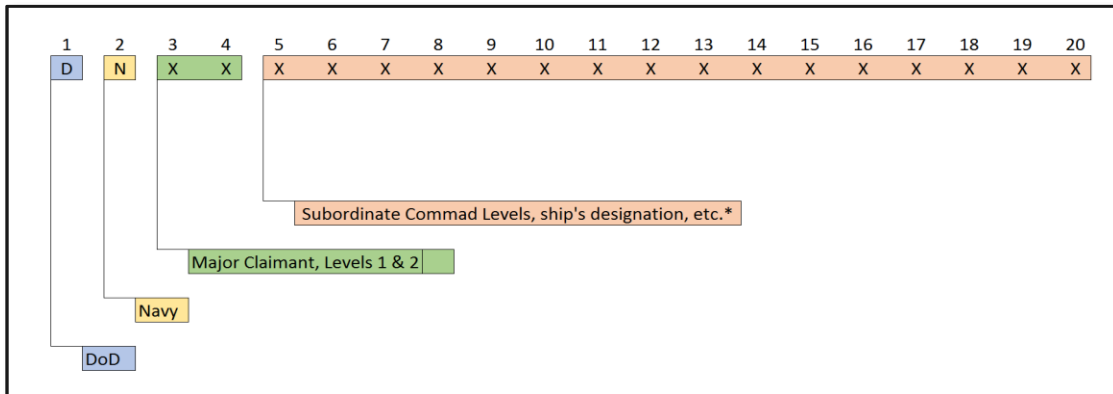


Figure Q-6: Navy Organization Name Example

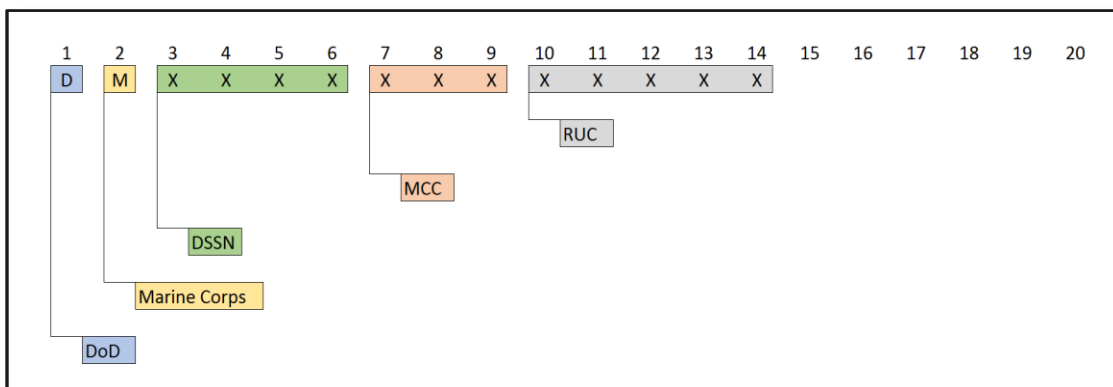


Figure Q-7: Marine Corps Organization Naming Convention

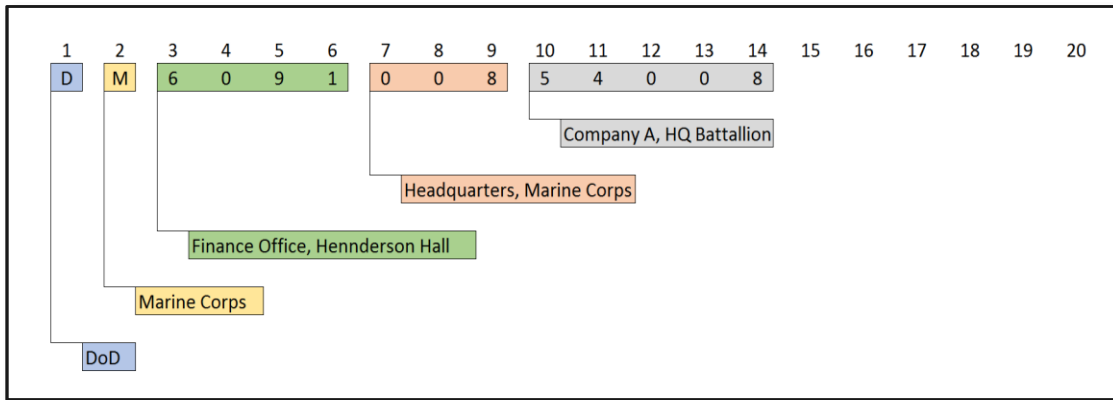


Figure Q-8: Marine Corps Organization Name Example

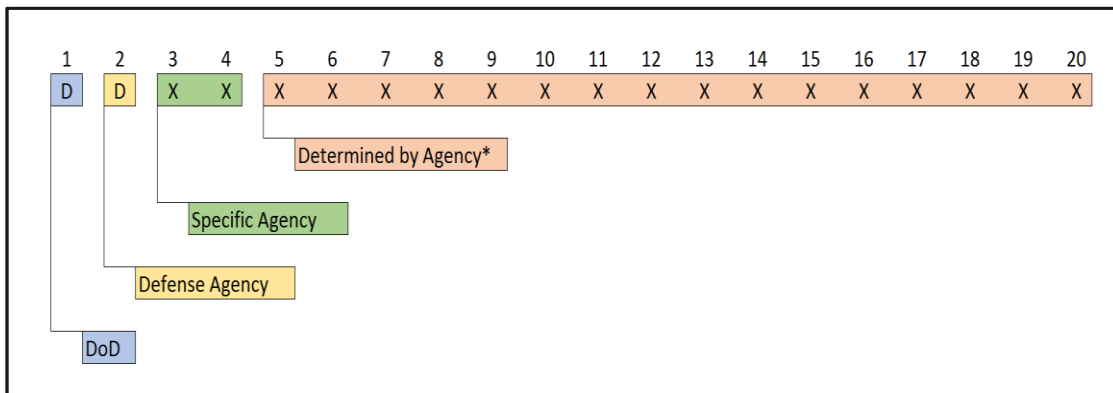


Figure Q-9: Defense Agency Organization Naming Convention

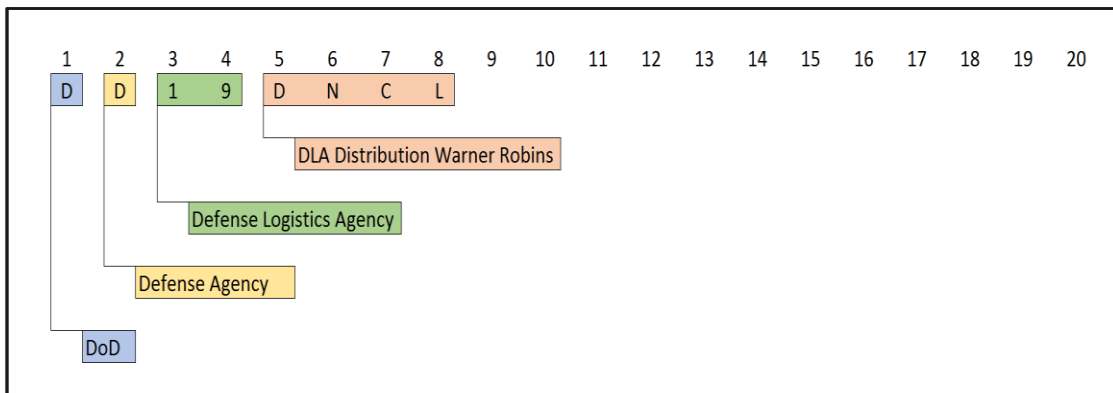


Figure Q-10: Defense Agency Organization Name Example

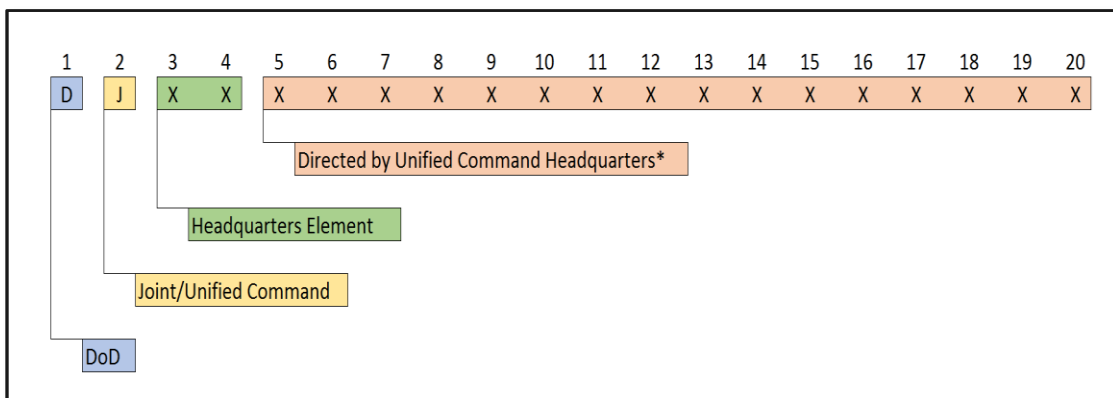


Figure Q-11: Joint/Unified Command Organization Naming Convention

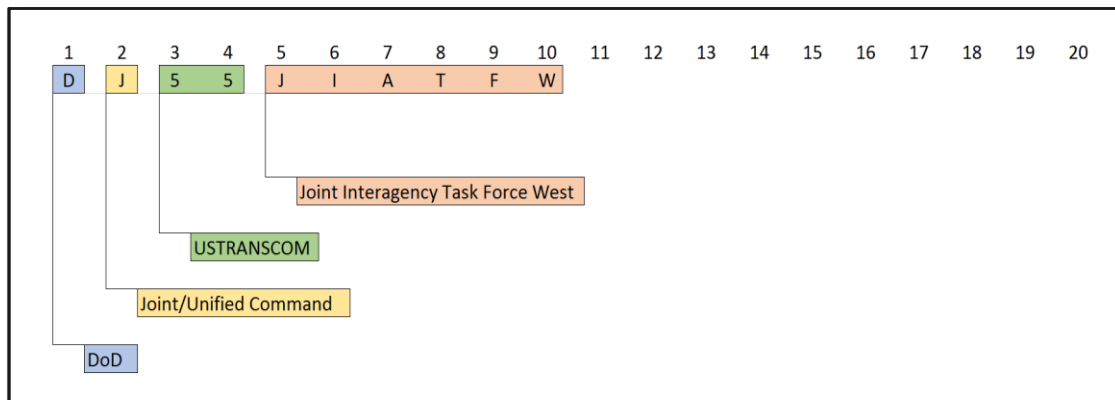


Figure Q-12: Joint/Unified Command Organization Name Example
