



**PUBLIC NOTICE OF SIGNED  
RECORD OF DECISION/REMEDIAL ACTION PLAN,  
FINDING OF SUITABILITY TO TRANSFER, AND  
RCRA CORRECTIVE ACTION DETERMINATION  
FORMER MARE ISLAND NAVAL SHIPYARD  
VALLEJO, CALIFORNIA**



The Department of the Navy (Navy) announces the signature of the Final Record of Decision/Remedial Action Plan (ROD/RAP) for the Investigation Area (IA) A2, Former North Building Ways (FNBW) Area, at former Mare Island Naval Shipyard (Mare Island), Vallejo, California. The ROD/RAP was signed by the Navy, Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), and San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board on August 30, 2010. A no further action recommendation was presented to the public in September 2009 for review and was selected as the remedy for IA A2 and FNBW Area after comments were received from the public.

The Navy also announces the signature of the Final Finding of Suitability to Transfer (FOST) for approximately 74.2 acres of property at Mare Island. The property identified for transfer in the Final FOST includes Parcels II, X-B(1), X-B(2), and the Sanitary Sewage Treatment Plant (SSTP) Outfall of Parcel I. The FOST was signed by the Navy on September 21, 2010. The Final FOST concluded that the parcels are environmentally suitable for transfer in accordance with Section 120(h) of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA).

The DTSC announces that a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Corrective Action Complete Determination ("RCRA Determination") and RCRA Hazardous Waste Facility Boundary Modification ("RCRA Boundary Modification") have been completed. DTSC finds that the RCRA corrective action requirements for the FOST property listed above have been completed through investigations and clean up actions; and has excluded this property from the former Mare Island RCRA hazardous waste facility property boundary. A summary of DTSC's RCRA Determination and RCRA Boundary Modification was included in the Final FOST. DTSC determined that this decision will not have a significant effect on the environment and issued a Notice of Exemption pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.

Mare Island is located on the Mare Island peninsula that extends into San Pablo Bay, 25 miles northeast of San Francisco. IA A2 is located in the northeast corner of Mare Island and includes the FNBW Area, which is the only CERCLA site within IA A2. Parcel II is located in the northeastern portion of Mare Island and includes the majority of IA A2 and FNBW Area. Parcels X-B(1) and X-B(2) are located in the southwestern portion of Mare Island, and the SSTP Outfall of Parcel I is located within submerged land off the western shore of Mare Island.
