
Navy Monthly Progress Report

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Department of the Navy (Navy) prepared this monthly progress report (MPR) to discuss environmental cleanup at the former Mare Island Naval Shipyard (MINS) in Vallejo, California. This MPR does not discuss cleanup work by the City of Vallejo, or it's contractor Lennar Mare Island (LMI), through the Navy's Eastern Early Transfer Parcel (EETP) the Environmental Services Cooperative Agreement (ESCA). The work completed by the city through LMI this month is reported separately. This MPR discusses progress made during the reporting period from January 31, 2020 through February 27, 2020. The information provided in this report includes updates to field work and removal actions, document submittals, the progress of regulatory associated reviews. issues with Navv environmental programs, and Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) Cleanup Team (BCT) and Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) meetings.

2.0 FIELD WORK, ACTIONS, AND UPCOMING EVENTS

During the month of February 2020, the Navy did not perform any field work.

3.0 DOCUMENT SUBMITTALS AND PROGRESS OF REGULATORY REVIEW

- Concurrence from DTSC on the Final Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office (DRMO) South Feasibility Study (FS) Data Collection Work Plan
- Comments received from DTSC on the Revised Draft Final, Final Status Survey Report of Debris Disposal Area near Dike 14, South Shore Area
