IN PROGRESS

10:30 Saturday morning the first C-130 Hercules aircraft arrived in Gulfport, Miss., beginning the deployment phase of the 317th Tactical Airlift Wing's Operational Readiness Inspection.

The lead aircraft followed by other aircraft bringing members of the 3rd Mobile Aerial Port Squadron, the Airlift Control Element and some maintenance support people.

Later Saturday, the mainstream aircraft began arriving at 20 minute intervals, bringing the rest of the support people and equipment.

Altogether, 24 aircraft arrived in Gulfport with more than 660 people. One hundred and thirty of the people were flight crew members from the 39th, 40th and 41st Tactical Airlift Squadrons from Pope AFB,

N.C. During their stay here, the aircraft will carry a basic five-man crew plus an additional loadmaster for certain airdrop missions.

Immediately after their arrival, support people began working 12-hour shifts to establish operations centers at the forward operating base. Included among these are a dispensary and a dining hall.

All through Saturday night and Sunday, the 3rd MAPS people processed loads and loaded aircraft scheduled to drop Sunday night.

On Sunday night, 18 aircraft were launched at 15 minute intervals. After these aircraft made their drops, using the Container Delivery System, they went to Pope AFB to pick up

heavy equipment to be used in drops scheduled for tonight and tomorrow night. Thirty-nine missions are scheduled for tonight.

This inspection is taking place in conjunction with a U.S. Army Emergency Deployment Readiness Exercise being conducted by the XVIII Airborne Corps from Fort Bragg, N.C.

The exercise simulates humanatarian relief mission deploying engineering , madical and military police teams and equipment into an earthquake stricken area.

Other units participating in the exercise are the U.S. Air Force Air Weather Service and the Mississippi Air National Guard, who are providing some logistic support.

CONFERENCE

In accordance with AFR 123-11, there is a Military Airlift Command Inspector General's Personal Conference session being held in building 289 at Pope AFB, N.C.

This conference runs through Friday and is open to anyone, military and Department of the Air Force civilian employees, who has a complaint,

The Pope team arrived in Gulfport Saturday and immediately established a system to provide transportation for the other incoming personnel. They are working 12-hour shift to keep the motor pool operating around the clock

The three buses the motor pool has are provid ing transportation to and from the aircraft for the flight crews.

Like everyone else participating in the ORI, the transportation people have a job to do and are striving to get it done.
