## APPLICATION FOR A RECEPTION FACILITY CERTIFICATE OF ADEQUACY FOR OZONE DEPLETING SUBSTANCES AND EXHAUST GAS CLEANING SYSTEM RESIDUE FORM D

The Act to Prevent Pollution From Ships (33 U.S.C. 1901 et. seq.) authorizes the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to issue certificates to Terminals and Ports verifying their adequacy to receive Ozone Depleting Substances (ODS) and Exhaust Gas Cleaning Systems residues (EGCS) from ships. International guidance for reception facilities under MARPOL Annex VI is contained in IMO Resolution MEPC.199(62). To continue to receive ships at a port or terminal an applicant must hold a Certificate of Adequacy for ODS or EGCS if it receives oceangoing tankers, or any other oceangoing ship of 400 gross tons or more requesting to discharge ODS or EGCS. To receive a Certificate of Adequacy for ODS or EGCS, application is required on Form D.
