1 Apr 22  1	1stMarDiv	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal A. Woloszyn, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of wrongful use and possession of a controlled substance. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 90 days confinement, and reduction to E-1.
5 Apr 22  2	3dMarDiv	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal R. S. Brown, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of possession, wrongful use, distribution, and conspiracy to distribute controlled substances, reckless driving, attempted disorderly conduct, and larceny. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 390 days of confinement, total forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and reduction to E-1.
5 Apr 22  3	II MEF	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Private J. Martinez, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of violation of a lawful general order and possession of controlled substances with intent to distribute. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 10 months of confinement, and forfeiture of \$500 pay per month for 10 months.
6 Apr 22  4	TECOM	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a military judge convicted Sergeant J. T. Fiegl, pursuant to the accused's plea, of possessing child pornography. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 18 months of confinement, and reduction to E-1.
7 Apr 22  5	1stMarReg, 1stMarDiv	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal B. R. Kerr, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of larceny. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge and 8 months confinement.
8 Apr 22  6	3dMLG	At a general court-martial at Naval Station Pearl Harbor, a panel of members acquitted a Marine of all charges and specifications.

12 Apr 22 7	2dMarDiv	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Corporal B. N. Harrison, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of extramarital sexual conduct, making a false official statement, and assault consummated by battery. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to 1 month of confinement and reduction to E-3.
14 Apr 22 8	3dMLG	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a panel of members acquitted a Marine of all charges and specifications.
20 Apr 22 9	MCESG	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Quantico, a military judge convicted Corporal A. C. Allen, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of assault consummated by battery and negligent dereliction of duty. The military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 7 months of confinement, and reduction to E-1. Pursuant to the pre-trial agreement, the convening authority will suspend all confinement in excess of 3 months.
22 Apr 22 10	3dMLG	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal J. R. Deleonfuentes, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of sexual assault and making a false official statement. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 24 months of confinement, total forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and reduction to E-1.
26 Apr 22 11	2dMarDiv	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal M. Q. Gibson, pursuant to the accused's plea, of possession of child pornography. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 18 months of confinement, total forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and reduction to E-1.
26 Apr 22 12	1stMarDiv	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a military judge convicted Corporal W. M. H. Jensen, pursuant to the accused's plea, of possession of child pornography. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 2 years of confinement, total forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and reduction to E-1.
27 Apr 22 13	MCESG	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Quantico, a military judge convicted Corporal M. A. Villones, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of possession of child pornography. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 31 months of confinement, total forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and reduction to E-1.

27 Apr 22 14	1stMarDiv	At an Art. 16(c)(2)(A) special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a military judge convicted Gunnery Sergeant R. R. Hirst of wrongful use of a controlled substance. The military judge sentenced the accused to 90 days of confinement and reduction to E-5.
27 Apr 22 15	1stMLG	At an Art. 16(c)(2)(A) special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a military judge acquitted a Marine of all charges and specifications.
28 Apr 22 16	H&HS, MCAS New River	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Air Station New River, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal C. A. Hale, pursuant to the accused's plea, of wrongfully taking/opening/stealing mail. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, forfeiture of \$700 pay per month for 10 months, and reduction to E-1.
28 Apr 22 17	3dMLG	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Foster, a panel of members acquitted a Marine of all charges and specifications.
29 Apr 22 18	2dMarDiv	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Corporal J. R. Long, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of violation of a lawful general order and possession, manufacture, and distribution of controlled substances. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 90 days of confinement, and reduction to E-1.
