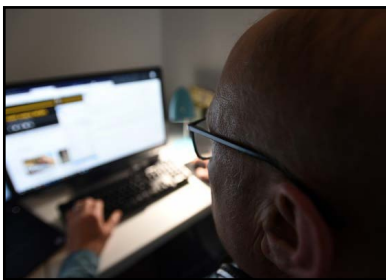
Army leaders collaborate to meet future equipping demands
