MEMORANDUM FOR: CIVILIAN ADVISORY PANEL

SUBJECT: CTD for CAP 31-21(R) "Unaccompanied Baggage for Dependent Student Travel"

1. Purpose: This item specifies the rules for unaccompanied baggage for travel of a civilian employee's dependent student, to mirror the Service member rules. The Department of State Standardized Regulations (DSSR) Section 285.1 contains the allowances for dependent student travel but does not specify the weight limitation for unaccompanied baggage.

2. This revision was approved by the Deputy Chair, Per Diem, Travel and Transportation, Allowance Committee.

3. These changes will be published in the May 1, 2022 JTR publication.

4. This revision is effective on April 26, 2022, when it was signed by the Deputy Chair.

<u>DoDI 1400.25, Vol. 1250</u> (Overseas Allowances and Differentials) authorizes educational travel, as specified in <u>DSSR Section 280</u>, for a dependent student of a DoD civilian employee assigned in a foreign area for travel to and from a school offering a full-time course of secondary or post-secondary education. Travel allowances for the dependent student's secondary education are instead of an education allowance. This travel is administered in accordance with DoD and Service regulations.
