HAP ARNOLD Commanding general of U.S. Army Air Forces during World War I.	MARY FEIK Pioneer in the fields of aviation mechanics and engineering, and post-CAP member.	ORVILLE & WILBUR WRIGHT First men to achieve powered, controlled, sustained, heavier-than-air flight.	EDDIE RICKENBACKER America's "Ace of Aces" during World War I; the world's CAP cadet to know him as "Eddie".	CHARLES LINDBERGH First man to fly across the Atlantic Ocean solo, non-stop, unaided, and in a single-engine biplane.	JIMMY Doolittle Pioneer in ball of aerodynamics, engineering and development of the first liquid-fueled rocket.	ROBERT GODDARD The "Father of Modern Rocketry" and developer of the first liquid-fueled rocket.	NEIL ARMSTRONG First man to set foot on the Moon aboard Apollo 11 on July 20, 1969 - "One giant leap for mankind".	BILLY MITCHELL America's first vocal advocate for military aviation; he proved the airplane could land ships.
