

Oversight Update: Ukraine Assistance

5 new planned projects This update summarizes recent DoD Office of Inspector General (OIG) oversight activities related to DoD support to Ukraine. Below are a few highlights.

On March 29, DoD Inspector General (IG) Robert P. Storch and his counterparts from the Department of State (State) and the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) Offices of Inspector General testified in front of the House Foreign Affairs Committee on oversight, transparency, and accountability of U.S. assistance to Ukraine.

During his testimony, IG Storch provided details on the Ukraine Oversight Interagency Working Group's coordinated approach to comprehensive oversight and a summary of the DoD OIG's past, present, and future oversight work in this area.

Additionally, in coordination with State and USAID OIGs, the DoD OIG released the Joint Oversight Of The Ukraine Response in late March. This report covers the whole-of-government effort to conduct independent, comprehensive oversight of the \$113 billion appropriated for the U.S. government's Ukraine response since Russia's February 2022 invasion, and fulfills reporting requirements under Sec. 1247 of the James M. Inhofe National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2023 and Sec. 1707 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023.

Evaluation of the Security Assistance Group-Ukraine's Sustainment Strategies for Selected Weapon Systems Transferred to the Government of Ukraine

The objective of this evaluation is to determine the extent to which the Security Assistance Group-Ukraine has developed and implemented sustainment strategies in support of U.S. air defense systems transferred to the Government of Ukraine, in accordance with each system's operational requirements.



Evaluation of the Security Assistance Group-Ukraine Coordination of the Movement of Defense Articles to Ukraine

The objective of this evaluation is to determine the effectiveness and efficiency of the Security Assistance Group-Ukraine's management, tracking, and coordination of the movement of U.S. defense articles to Ukraine.

The DoD OIG is currently planning five new potential oversight projects related to Ukraine, and intends to announce two of those projects in the near future:

- Audit of Army Oversight of Contractor Performance at the Remote Maintenance and Distribution Cell Ukraine, and;
- Evaluation of DoD Contracting Officer Actions on Defense Contract Audit Agency Findings and Recommendations Related to DoD Contractor Proposals for Ukraine Security Assistance.

The OIGs of the Department of Defense, Department of State, and U.S. Agency for International Development are committed to coordinating oversight of Ukraine aid. Get the latest on each OIG's planned, ongoing, and completed work at their respective websites.
