ACCESS TO STIBNITE GOLD PROJECT

Transportation Route (Mid-May through Mid-December) Johnson Creek Route

During this time period, the route from the City of Cascade to Yellow Pine and Stibnite using Johnson Creek Road will be used, as described below:

- Northeast on Warm Lake Road (FR 579) 36 miles to Landmark
- North on Johnson Creek Road (FR 413) 25 miles to Yellow Pine
- East on Stibnite Road (FR 412) 14 miles to Stibnite

The portions of this route that pose the greatest risk to safety, or of injury or environmental accident, are the portions including Johnson Creek Road and Stibnite Road. These sections of road are generally steeper, narrower, and closer to the river. As a result, these portions of road are the primary determining factor related to the types of controls and mitigation measures to be implemented.

Transportation Route – Approximately Mid-December through Mid-March – South Fork Route

During this approximate time period, the route from the City of Cascade to Yellow Pine and Stibnite via South Fork Road will be used, as described below:

- Northeast on Warm Lake Road (FR 579) 24 miles to Knox
- North on South Fork Road (FR 474/674) 31 miles
- East on East Fork Road (FR 48/412) 15 miles to Yellow Pine
- East on Stibnite Road (FR 412) 14 miles to Stibnite

The portions of this route that pose the greatest risk to safety, or of injury or environmental accident, are the portions including the South Fork Road and the Stibnite Road. These sections of road are generally steeper, narrower, and closer to the river. As a result, these portions of road are the primary determining factor related to the types of controls and mitigation measures to be implemented. If future logistics, weather conditions, fish and wildlife protection needs, or other conditions dictate that snow removal take place on Johnson Creek Road throughout the winter, then this SOP shall be revised accordingly.

Both routes are depicted on the figure below.
