



Oversight Update: Ukraine Assistance

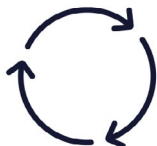

This update summarizes recent DoD Office of Inspector General (OIG) oversight activities related to DoD support to Ukraine. Below are a few highlights.

In late January, DoD Inspector General Robert P. Storch and other DoD OIG leaders and staff traveled to Germany, Poland, and Ukraine together with the heads of the OIGs for the Department of State and U.S. Agency for International Development.

In Germany and Poland, the OIG delegation met with officials from U.S. Army Europe and Africa, the Security Assistance Group–Ukraine, and the International Donation Coordination Center to gather key insights from officials on the ground. These discussions will help inform oversight of U.S. security assistance, direct budget support, energy assistance, and humanitarian aid to Ukraine.

While in Ukraine, OIG leaders met with the Ukrainian Prime Minister, Minister of Defense, Minister of Finance, Prosecutor General, leaders of Ukrainian anti-corruption entities, and other officials. During the meeting, Inspector General Storch and his colleagues delivered a concerted message about the importance of accountability and discussed efforts to ensure robust oversight of U.S. support to Ukraine.

Audit of Explosives Safety and Munitions Risk Management in Support of Ukraine Operations

The objective of this audit is to determine whether the DoD is executing Explosives Safety and Munitions Risk Management for explosives and munitions provided to assist Ukraine operations in accordance with Federal and DoD policies.



Audit of the DoD Award and Administration of Noncompetitively Awarded Contracts in Support of Ukraine

The objective of this audit is to determine whether DoD contracting officials properly awarded and administered noncompetitively awarded contracts in support of the Ukraine response, according to Federal and DoD regulations.



Evaluation of the DoD's Enhanced End-Use Monitoring of Defense Articles Provided to Ukraine

The objective of this evaluation is to determine the extent to which the DoD is conducting enhanced end-use monitoring of defense articles provided to Ukraine in accordance with DoD policy.

The DoD OIG is currently planning five potential oversight projects related to Ukraine, including announcing two new projects in the near future:

- Audit of DoD Maintenance for Military Equipment Provided to Ukraine, and
- Evaluation of the Security Assistance Group–Ukraine's Sustainment Strategies for Selected Weapon Systems Transferred to the Government of Ukraine.

The OIGs of the Department of Defense, Department of State, and U.S. Agency for International Development are committed to coordinating oversight of Ukraine aid. Get the latest on each OIG's planned, ongoing, and completed work at their respective websites.
