SUBJECT: CTD for CAP 50-23(I), "Update Administrative Household Goods (HHG) Weight Allowance Locations Table for Poland and Romania"

1. Purpose: This item updates the Joint Travel Regulations Supplement, Administrative Household Goods (HHG) Weight Allowance Locations Table to rescind household goods weight allowance restrictions for Navy civilian employees assigned to Poland and Romania. Civilian employees assigned to Redzikowo, Poland and Deveselu, Romania are now authorized the full HHG weight allowance.

- 3. U.S. Navy CAP initiated this revision.
- 4. This revision is effective when published on the Website.

1. Effectively immediately, request rescinding of reference (a) of all limitations for Navy civilian employees on permanent change of station orders assigned to Naval Support Facility Redzikowo (NSFR), Poland. Navy employees orders may reflect their full joint joint travel regulations (JTR) allowances, to include shipment of household goods and privately owned vehicles (POVs).

2. JTR paragraphs 0543, 054301-A. and 054705-A. states, "Commanding Officers, or their designated representatives, who assign civilian employees OCONUS determine civilian employee's eligibility for POV transportation at government expense." I have determined adequate logistics support are available to meet employee's needs as well as off-base housing availability and POV registration. Rescinding the employee's limitation meets the best interest of the Navy and employees.

3. Current Navy employees assigned to NSFR, on permanent change of station order with at least 12-months or more remaining on current orders, may have their orders amended. Employees on new permanent change of station order may be permitted all related JTR household goods (HHG) allowances and POV shipment, if eligible.

4. Employees should maximize use of non-temporary storage at origin due to the cost of local commercial storage and limited availability. POVs should be mechanically sound before shipping to NSFR because replacement parts for many American models are not readily available.

Effectively immediately, request to rescind reference (a) of all limitations for Navy civilian employees on permanent change of station orders assigned to U.S. Naval Support Facility Deveselu (NSFD). Navy employee orders may reflect their full Joint Travel Regulations (JTR) allowances, to include shipment of household goods and privately owned vehicles (POVs).

2. JTR paragraphs 0543, 054301-A, and 054705-A state, "Commanding Officers, or their designated representatives, who assign civilian employees OCONUS determine civilian employee's eligibility for POV transportation at government expense." Adequate logistics support are available to meet employee's needs as well as off-base housing availability and POV registration. Rescinding employee's limitation meets the best interest of the Navy and employees.

3. Current Navy employees assigned to NSFD on permanent change of station orders with at least 12-months or more remaining on current orders may have their orders amended. Employees on new permanent change of station orders may be permitted all related JTR Household Goods allowances and POV shipment, if eligible.

4. Employees should maximize use of non-temporary storage at origin due to the cost of local commercial storage and limited availability. POVs should be mechanically sound before shipping to Romania because replacement parts for many American models are not readily available.

Administrative Household Goods (HHG) Weight Allowance Locations

A. <u>Authority</u>. In accordance with the Joint Travel Regulations (JTR), paragraph (par.) 051402, household goods (HHG) weight allowances can be administratively reduced at a permanent duty station (PDS) outside the continental United States (OCONUS) based on factors at that location. Only the locations listed in this document have administratively reduced HHG weight allowances. If a location does not appear in the tables in this document, then it is not a location with an administratively reduced HHG weight allowance.

B. <u>Authorization Period</u>. The reduced administrative HHG weight allowances for the locations listed in this document are effective until rescinded.

C. Submission Process.

1. The Uniformed Services may submit requests to establish or amend a location's weight allowance. Refer to the JTR, par. 051402, and Service regulations for the submission process. All submissions must be sent through the Service's or Agency's Military Advisory Panel or Civilian Advisory Panel member. See the Defense Travel Management Office's <u>website</u> for contact information.

2. A Service member or civilian employee may request HHG weight allowance increases. Refer to the JTR, par. 051402, for a Service member or the JTR, par. 054304, for a civilian employee.

D. <u>Unaccompanied Baggage</u>. Refer to the JTR, par. 051403 for a Service member or the JTR, pars. 054304 and 054305, for a civilian employee.

E. <u>Net Weight Allowance Determination</u>. Net weight is used to determine the weight allowances in this document. Refer to the JTR, par. 051404, for a Service member or the JTR, par. 054304, for a civilian employee.

F. <u>Professional Books, Papers, and Equipment or Required Medical Equipment</u>. The weight of the administratively reduced HHG allowance does not include the weight of professional books, papers, and equipment (PBP&E) or required medical equipment, unless specified in the tables in this document.

G. <u>HHG Allowances When the Assignment or Time Remaining is Fewer Than 12 Months</u>. Refer to the JTR, par. 051305.A7d.
