

Navy Requests Community Input On Environmental Cleanup At Former MCAS Tustin

Former Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Tustin was a major flight center for the Marine Corps between 1942 and 1999. Of the original 1,600 acres, about 1,357 acres have been transferred for development and reuse by the City of Tustin, private developers, and public institutions. Upon completion of environmental cleanup, the remaining acreage will be transferred for similar future use.

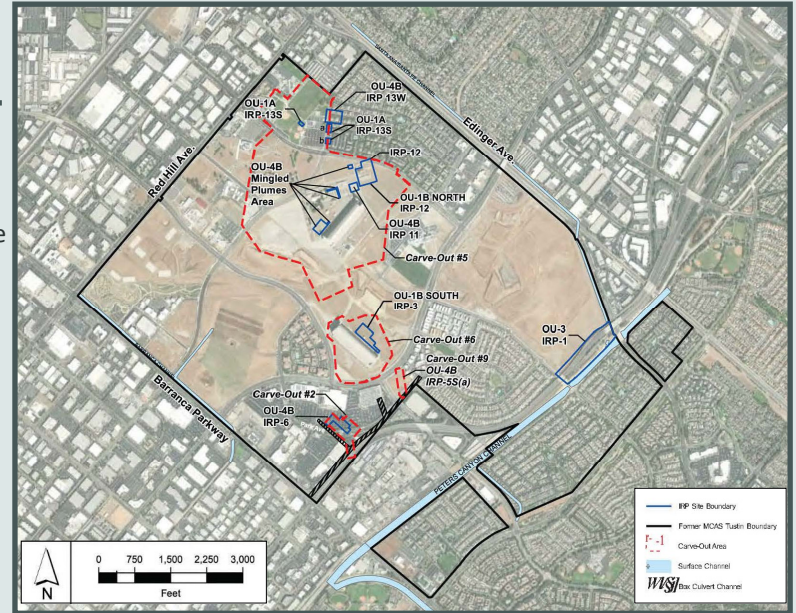
Some areas of soil and groundwater were contaminated from past use. Contamination resulted from the use of training areas, general maintenance and cleaning of equipment, pesticides, and a former base landfill.

The U.S. Department of the Navy (Navy) manages the ongoing environmental cleanup at Former MCAS Tustin. The environmental cleanup program is conducted in accordance with federal and state requirements. In 1999, the Navy entered a Federal Facility Site Remediation Agreement with the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC). DTSC is the lead regulatory agency responsible for overseeing the investigations and cleanup.
