## SUBJECT: Audit of the Military Services' Oversight of Privatized Military Housing Maintenance (Project No. D2024-D000AT-0114.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we plan to begin the subject audit in April 2024. The objective of this audit is to determine whether the Military Services conducted effective oversight of military privatized housing maintenance performed at units managed by Hunt Military Communities in accordance with the property management agreements and DoD policy. This audit will examine facilities housing personnel from different Military Services, and it could lead to recommendations at different levels and across the Services depending upon the issues identified. We may revise the objective as the audit proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this audit in accordance with the Government Accountability Office's generally accepted government auditing standards.

We will perform the audit at Joint Base San Antonio–Lackland, Texas; Naval Air Station Kingsville, Texas; Marine Corps Base Hawaii; Joint Base Pearl Harbor–Hickam, Hawaii; Redstone Arsenal, Alabama; and Moody Air Force Base, Georgia. We may identify additional locations during the audit.

We request that you designate a staff member to serve as our point of contact for this audit within **5 days** of this memorandum. The point of contact should be a Government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—and knowledgeable of military privatized housing maintenance related to the objective.
