One of the systems, the Call Recording Application (CRA), records telephone conversations between customers and customer service representatives (CSRs) in DFAS' contact centers. The centers are located in Cleveland, Indianapolis, Rome, and Columbus. CRA captures a sampling of the computer screens used by CSRs to answer inquiries. This system facilitates the process of monitoring and evaluating the recorded audio and computer screens used by CSRs in order to provide training, collect data in support of the CSRs' annual performance evaluation, and provide information used for business process improvements. The recorded audio and captured systems' screen records can potentially include any combination of the following information: financial information, home/cell phone, mailing/home address, marital status, mother's middle/maiden name, name(s), official duty telephone, personal e-mail address, position/title, rank/grade, social security number (SSN) (Full or in any form), dependent information, and tax status.
