SUBJECT: Evaluation of the Movement of Ukraine and Israel-Bound Equipment through Aerial Ports of Embarkation within the Continental United States
(Project No. D2024-DEV0PC-0166.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we are initiating the subject evaluation.

The objective of this evaluation is to assess the effectiveness with which the DoD Components are accounting for and processing defense materials from their points of origin through the Aerial Ports of Embarkation for delivery to Ukraine and Israel. We may revise the objective as the evaluation proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this evaluation in accordance with the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency “Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation.”

We will perform the evaluation at Dover Air Force Base and Joint Base Charleston, as well as continental U.S.-based military depot locations. We may identify additional organizations and locations during the evaluation.

We request that you designate two points of contact for this evaluation within 5 days of this memorandum. One point of contact should be a Government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—who is knowledgeable about the movement of defense materials through the Aerial Ports of Embarkation. The second point of contact should be a member of the Senior Executive Service or a General/Flag Officer who is familiar with the movement of defense materials through the Aerial Ports of Embarkation and could serve as a point of engagement with DoD Office of Inspector General senior leaders, if necessary.
