1 May 24 1	1st MAW	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Foster, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal O. M. Mendezvelez, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of sexual abuse of a child not involving sexual contact (communication of indecent language). Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 16 months confinement, total forfeitures, and reduction to E-1.
1 May 24 2	3d MARDIV	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a military judge convicted Corporal T. T. Willis, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of conspiracy, larceny of non-military property of a value more than \$1000, and attempted larceny. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 6 months of confinement, total forfeitures, and reduction to E-1.
1 May 24 3	RTR MCRD San Diego	At an Art. 16(c)(2)(A) special court-martial at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, a military judge convicted Gunnery Sergeant C. Burgess of two specifications of maltreatment and three specifications of violating a lawful general order. The military judge sentenced the accused to reduction to E-6.
1 May 24 4	TRNG CMD	At an Art. 16(c)(2)(A) special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge acquitted a Marine of all charges and specifications.
3 May 24 5	2d MAW	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Captain R. Durbin of conduct unbecoming an officer. The military judge sentenced the accused to a reprimand.
6 May 24 6	3d MARDIV	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a military judge convicted Sergeant J. W. McKay, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of wrongful broadcast or distribution of intimate visual images. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to reduction to E-1.
8 May 24 7	3d MARDIV	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal K. M. Lynk, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of conspiracy and larceny of non-military property of a value of more than \$1000. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to 4 months confinement, forfeitures of \$1,344.00 per month for four months, and reduction to E-1.
8 May 24 8	2d MLG	At an Art. 16(c)(2)(A) special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge acquitted a Marine of all charges and specifications.

11 May 24 9	3d MLG	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Foster, a panel of members convicted Private First Class C. S. Baines of abusive sexual contact without the consent of the other person and unlawful entry. The panel of members sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 3 years confinement, and reduction to E-1.
13 May 24 10	7th ESB	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal B. Spencer, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of 4 specifications of larceny. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 60 days confinement, forfeitures of \$1,344 per month for 2 months, and reduction to E-1.
14 May 24 11	WFTBn, MCRD San Diego	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, a military judge convicted Sergeant T. M. Hawkins, pursuant to the accused's pleas, to domestic violence - commission of a violent offense. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 58 days confinement, and reduction to E-1.
16 May 24 12	MCAS Beaufort	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, South Carolina, a military judge convicted Private A. D. Furrenes, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of guilty to attempted sexual abuse of a child involving indecent language and attempted sexual abuse of a child involving indecent conduct. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 15 months confinement, and total forfeitures of pay and allowances.
16 May 24 13	3d MARDIV	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Foster, a military judge convicted Master Sergeant K. O. Heinle, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of attempted sexual abuse of a child. A panel of members sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 176 days confinement, and reduction to E-1.
21 May 24 14	3d MARDIV	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal J. G. Mpanzu, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of conspiracy and larceny of non-military property of a value of more than \$1000. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 180 days confinement, and a reduction to E-1.
21 May 24 15	3d MARDIV	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Foster, a military judge convicted Private First Class G. A. Dalessandro, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of attempted sexual abuse of a child. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 11 months confinement, total forfeitures, and a reduction to E-1.
23 May 24 16	3d MAW	At an Art. 16(c)(2)(A) special court-martial at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, a military judge acquitted a Marine of all charges and specifications.

24 May 24 17	3d MAW	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a panel of members convicted Lance Corporal J. Zavala of involuntary manslaughter and two specifications of false official statements. The members sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 27 months confinement, reduction to E-1, and a reprimand.
24 May 24 18	2d MARDIV	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal N. C. Haynes, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of burglary, resisting apprehension, and failure to obey a lawful order. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 130 days confinement, and reduction to E-1.
28 May 24 19	MCSFBn, Kings Bay	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, South Carolina, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal R. B. Eicher, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of domestic violence and assault consummated by battery. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to total forfeitures, and reduction to E-1.
28 May 24 20	3d MLR	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, a military judge convicted Private J. C. Simms, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of use a controlled substance and possession of less than 30 grams of marijuana. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge.
30 May 24 21	2d MLG	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, a military judge convicted Cpl T. J. Wade, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of possession and distribution of child pornography and soliciting the commission of an offense. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 20 months confinement, and reduction to E-1.
31 May 24 22	1st MLG	At a general court-martial at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, a military judge convicted Lance Corporal D. Arnold, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child not involving sexual contact. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, 12 months confinement, and reduction to E-1.
31 May 24 23	3d MAW	At a special court-martial at Marine Corps Air Station Miramar, a military judge convicted Sergeant K. Ascencio, pursuant to the accused's pleas, of two specifications of use of a controlled substance; one specification of the distribution of a controlled substance; and two specifications of introduction of a controlled substances. Consistent with the plea agreement, the military judge sentenced the accused to a bad conduct discharge, 10 months confinement, forfeitures of \$1,000 per month for 10 months, and reduction to E-1.
